




The Priemer Babies are Home!

Pastor's Page

Grace and peace to you,

I find it hard to believe that it has been three months since the rapid spread of the COVID-19 virus shut everything down. I feel in some ways it was just yesterday that we stopped in person gatherings, but in many more ways it feels like an eternity ago. As we celebrate our countries independence this month, I think about how this virus has taken much of our independence away. I am extremely saddened when I speak with our members who are on lockdown isolation in their senior living facilities. I hear stories of loneliness and boredom, and the deep desire just to see people. I worry about members who are separated because of health issues. I can't imagine not being able to see or be with my ailing family member during their greatest time of need. There are so many stories of families and dear friends not being able to see or touch each other that it breaks my heart, and I wonder where is God? I know this is probably not the first time many of us have wondered where God is in the midst of difficult times, but this time seems different. This virus has caused so much stress, strife and death for so long that we just can't fathom that it could go on for another six months. As I sat and prayed about the virus, our family of faith and our world, God kept placing on my heart the wilderness time of the Israelites. The Israelites wondered in the desert for forty years! I pray COVID-19 won't last that long!! I'm sure they, like us, wondered how long their wilderness time would last. As we have read the story of the Israelites wondering time in the desert, we can look back at it and say their forty years was a journey where they learned and experienced God along the way. Can we say the same thing? Can we say these past months have been a journey to new learning or new relationships?

As we live into what is hopefully a temporary "new normal", how can we see this as a time of learning? Early on in the COVID crisis I read a devotional that has helped me endure this journey. Prior to reading the devotional I was wondering why God wouldn't stop the virus, and why won't God help us. After reading the devotional I learned I needed to shift my focus and change my request. I learned my prayer should be, "Lord, show me where you are active in this challenging time." Instead of wondering why God wasn't here, I began looking for God's activity... God's movement in the world. By reframing my thoughts, I began to see the manna in the desert. I began to see God at work in the midst of these challenges. I have seen 1000 masks made by extremely dedicated members. I have seen 60 Sherwood Elementary families, who wouldn't have normally had many groceries this summer, receive groceries three times this summer because of the love of this church. I have seen families from Raise Up Families get a loving Pines dinner and send off for their children as they were leaving for a week of summer camp. I have seen our amazing Shepherds continually make extra calls to their "flock" to make sure they stayed connected to their church family. My list of how I have seen God's activity can go on and on.

As we celebrate the birth of our nation this month, let's also celebrate the re-birth of our faith in God who is always active and always provides. Just as our ever-present God provided water for Hagar and Ishmael in the desert, and a ram for Abraham and Isaac, our God also provided a Savior for you and me to remind us that God is always with us and that God always provides... even in the midst of a pandemic.

Dear Prayer Partners,



IN THE MEANTIME

So what have you been doing in the meantime? **After** B<u>efore-Covid</u>, but **before** <u>After-Covid</u>, that is. Social distancing, perhaps? Now obviously, it was a totally different situation, but it has occurred to me that Jesus was the complete antithesis of a social distancer – he was the ultimate people-person!

The New Testament gives us dozens of little vignettes of Jesus *doing* things. He preached. He taught. He prayed and walked and fed people and healed and encouraged and rebuked and promised and offered them hope. But what was he doing in all the meantime's? Well, more of the same, I imagine. Sometimes he solved their problems. But even more - he *listened* to them, I'm sure. Because he loved them and was happy to share the joys and burdens of their lives. He was here on the ground *because* of the people. He cared. And how do I know this? The gospels don't <u>say</u> he listened! I know this because anything else would be totally out of character – impossible to even imagine! Jesus wasn't about photo-ops or sound-bites or impressing the media! He was about the people. And therefore I know *he listened*!!

So what does that have to do with Stephen Ministry? Just this – Stephen Ministry is an exact follow-on to the character of Jesus himself. It's about that same love for people – because he did! It's about listening because that's what he did. It's about walking alongside – because he did. It is *not*, however, about fixing your problem – because he was Jesus and still is, and Stephen Ministers are not. They are committed, though, to sharing Christ's love by being there with you during hard times, by listening and sharing your struggles, and by praying for you and with you. 

Stewardship



Stewardship Notes:

- 1. Pledge income is above target for 5 months operations—at the end of first five months of the year, 44% of pledge income is received. Non-pledge income is below budget with only 23% of non-pledge income received at the end of the first 5 months. Total Income continues to be right on target.
- 2. Overall, expenses are well below budget expectations. Mission expenditures reflect payment of 50% benevolence payments in May. Remaining benevolence funds will be paid in November.
- 3. YTD Total Income is \$331,241; YTD total expenses are \$265,383; with Net Income thru May at \$65,858.



Session Meeting Notes

The Session met for its regular stated meeting on June 22. Here are some highlights:

- Tentatively approved resuming in-person Sunday School on July 19, pending a final decision in early July. The question of re-opening to outside groups also will be considered at that time.
- Heard that the mask makers are on the verge of hitting the goal of making 1,000 masks.
- Heard that the church has received grants from the presbytery to support the Sherwood meals program and the Feed My Starving Children event.
- Heard that pledge income continues to be strong and that non-pledge income continues to lag.
