



Pastor's Page

Grace and Peace in the name of Jesus Christ,

During my devotion and prayer time the other day God placed a wonderful passage from Jeremiah in front of me that really spoke to me, and I felt spoke to all that is going on here at Pines. The passage is Jeremiah 17:7-8:

7 Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord.8 They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream.

It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green;

in the year of drought it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

This passage begins with an incredible reminder to us all of the gift we receive when we trust in God... we are blessed. When you and I truly trust in the Lord we understand and receive so many blessings from God. I love the imagery here of those who trust in the Lord will be like a tree planted by steam that is constantly nourished by the living water that flows near its roots. This tree will not fade or loose its leaves when heat and drought come, and maybe most importantly it won't become anxious during the challenging time. This was a great reminder to me considering the season we are in at Pines. With the departure of Ashley, our Children's Director, and Pastor Barbara many may see this as a time of extreme heat or drought in the life of Pines. Fear and worry about our future may arise in the minds of some, but this passage is very clear that if we truly trust the Lord with our worship, staffing, programing and finances we will make it through these times of heat. If we truly trust the Lord then even in these times we will continue to send out roots, we will continue to stay green and even bear fruit.

I know this might be a time of worry for some, but the Pines family is strong, and we have laid strong roots by living water for almost sixty years. If we trust the Lord, I know the Lord will bless us in ways we have never imagined. I am confident this family of faith will bear amazing fruit that will honor God and bless the Kingdom.

As we continue to send out roots to the living water, the Session has begun the process of looking forward. Due to the immediate need to fill two positions, and our current finances, we will be searching for a part-time Interim Associate Pastor for Children's Ministry and Adult Discipleship. The primary responsibility of this position will be children's ministry, with a smaller portion dedicated to spiritual growth, worship leadership, and pastoral care. The Session also approved searching for a 10 hour a week Children's Ministry Assistant.

The Session plans to discuss long term staffing models at their retreat in early March. They will study the churches mission and finances to envision appropriate staffing models that will help Pines live into its mission to make disciples who know, love, and trust in Jesus Christ by Looking Upward, Growing Inward, and Serving Outward.

CHRISTMAS EVE AND NEW YEAR REFLECTIONS

By the time you read this, your mind and heart (as well as store displays and advertisements) will have shifted from Christmas to Valentine's Day. Nonetheless, I wanted to share some Christmas Eve and New Year reflections as I experienced this special time of year at Pines.

Christmas Eve is such a blessed time as we celebrate the greatest gift any of us will ever receive in the birth of our Savior, Jesus Christ, and we remember the love of family and friends who enrich our lives. For many of us, worshiping on Christmas Eve is a treasured tradition and, over the years, many of the children at Pines have told me these worship services are among their favorite "church memories".

I am embarrassed to admit that, for many years, I took for granted the work that occurs "behind the scenes" to make possible the three worship services Pines has historically offered on this special night. Last year, I tried to be more intentional in noticing the many people who worked and "donated" a portion of their Christmas Eve to making these services possible. While I know I have missed some, I offer the following list of faith-filled servants who graciously gave of their time to make our worship experiences possible:

Ministers and our Music Director, who lead worship during each of the three services and give up treasured family time to do so, in addition to likely having a shortened night of rest prior to Christmas Day

Talented musicians and vocalists who give of their time and talent to enrich our worship experience with the music of the season; can you imagine worshiping at Christmas without music and how different the experience would be?

Sound and visual technicians who make it possible for us to see and hear in order to fully participate in worship Ushers who welcome and greet people on the occasion when the church likely has the most visitors of any time during the year AND who clean up the sanctuary after each worship service (yes, the sanctuary was cleaned after the 11pm service)

Duty elders who arrive before 5pm to open our church facility and get it ready as well as close and secure it after midnight on Christmas Day

Those who prepare the communion elements for the 7pm service

Lay volunteers who spend time before the service to prepare to be liturgists as they read some of the familiar scriptural passages and light the Advent candles

Finally, there are many who work for countless hours prior to Christmas Eve to plan the services, recruit volunteers and prepare bulletins, among other duties.

We are blessed to be part of a church family where so many give with loving hearts to make such experiences possible. One of my resolutions this year is to be more intentional in thanking these people for their loving and faithful service "behind the scenes". I hope some of you will join me in doing so.

While speaking of new year resolutions, I heard both Bill Willis and Andy Gans challenge us in late December and early January to be intentional in setting aside time and accepting the hope which only Jesus can provide in having the courage to take small steps each day to share God's love and make our world a better place. As I suspect many do, I struggle with maintaining my focus on being intentional in making a difference via my actions.

However, this year as I was leaving Pines after worship on January 5, I drove by a Pines member walking alongside a nearby street while picking up large pieces of trash and litter along the road. That image stayed in my mind. Later that afternoon, Linda and I went for a walk in our neighborhood and halfway through I finally opened my eyes to notice trash along the roadside. Instead of walking by, I picked up the pieces I saw and took them home.

Although I know of some at Pines who do this on a regular basis, the powerful image of seeing another Pines member beautifying the area surrounding our beloved church made an impression on me which I hope will remain fresh in my mind as I go through this year. My hope is that it will lead me to more frequently take advantage of opportunities to love and care for all of God's creation, including His children. My prayer is that all of us will do so and occasionally share our stories to encourage each other.

Thanks be to God for the gift of those at Pines who love and serve Him in a multitude of ways. Phil Wetz



- Voted to form a Search Committee for an Interim Associate Pastor and an Interim Children's Ministry Assistant.


