Grace, Peace and Thanksgiving to you,

As I sit and write this article, the temperatures outside are still hitting, or coming close to, 90 degrees. It's hard to believe that we are in the midst of fall, but change is coming soon. On November 2nd our time will change, and we'll fall back one hour, and my hope is the temperatures will change around the same time, if not sooner.

Change is happening with our staff as we look for a Director of Faith Formation (DoFF). This position is a little different that the position Kristin held. This redesigned position will work with all areas of Christian Education with an emphasis on children and youth. In an effort to strengthen our relationship with the preschool, our new hire will become Chaplain to the school and work with preschool director Connie Pike, to develop a Christian education program to be delivered to each classroom. The new DoFF will also work with Mrs. Pike in developing and sharing chapel messages with the children. We pray this new connection will not only strengthen the children's faith but also strengthen our connection to our amazing preschool children, parents and staff. James 1:17 stresses that every gift - every gift - comes from God, regardless of how they manifest on Earth.



Pines' support thus far in the campaign exemplifies the hymn, which calls us to be "one in the Spirit", to "walk with each other" and "work with each other". But we can do even more!

If you haven't filled out a pledge card yet, you can find one in the pew racks across the Sanctuary, or look for one to arrive at home in November. The sooner you pledge the better, as it allows Pines and its various committees to budget for 2026 with more confidence.

Echoing James, our central hymn closes with this: "All praise to the Father, from whom all things come."






STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

The September 30, 2025 financial statements (attached) can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Total income received through September 30 was \$540,859 (74% of budget, 1pp behind target.) Pledge income was \$428,499 (5pp ahead) and unpledged income was \$49,638 (18pp behind). Interest income was \$14,752 (8pp ahead).
- 2. Overall expenses were at \$559,774 (1pp over).
- 3. Net income through August was (-\$18,915).
- 4. Current assets on September 30 stood at \$377,470, primarily in the Raymond James Money Market fund. Texas Presbyterian Fund Account assets, updated for the quarter, stood at a record high of \$1,391,641.
- 5. As of October 20, the 2026 Stewardship Campaign has resulted in pledges of \$562,492, the highest level at this point in a campaign since 2019. Pledges are still being encouraged and accepted by turning in your pledge card to the offering plate or to Alexis Graham, accounting manager. A big thank you to those that have already made their pledge!

Make Time to Laugh & Play

Engage in an activity or spend time with someone (or a pet) that brings you laughter and joy!

Rely on Coping Skills

Regularly incorporate a moment for deep breathing into your day and/or worship service. Breathe in. Breathe out. Repeat.

9. Become an Advocate

Connect with a local leader and listen to their goals for strengthening the community. Which goals spark your passion? How can you join this work?

Engage in Self-Compassion

Practice speaking to yourself with kindness and grace today. Write down 5 qualities you appreciate in yourself.

11. Overcome a Fear

Pick an obstacle standing in your (or your congregation's) way. What steps can you take to face these fears? Take them.

12. Stand Firmly in Hope

Name a hope you hold for yourself, your church, and for the next generation. Imagine standing firmly in the future where those hopes are realized.

"Set among the Botanic Garden's verdant and diverse natural exhibits and featuring a complementary soundtrack, Radiant Nature creates a truly serene and almost otherworldly quest experience that is not to be missed."



Radiant Nature opens at the Houston Botanic Garden on **Friday, November 7.** The event will run on weekends (Friday through Sunday) as well as select weeknights before and after the holiday through February 23.

Tickets are priced at \$28.50 for adults and children aged 4 and over. Children aged 3 and under are permitted free entrance. The organization recommends visitors purchase their tickets online to secure their preferred date and 30-minute entry window.
