Pastor's Page

Grace, Love & Peace to you,

Welcome to February, the month of little heart shaped candies with cute sayings on them, unending Hallmark advertisements, red roses and of course the words... "Will you be my Valentine?" This month is dedicated to reminding us all to show our love and appreciation to others. What a great reminder it is to share love. Sharing love is what Jesus' life and ministry were all about. Jesus not only taught, but he also modeled what true love really meant and looked like.

This year we have a very special opportunity to remember that love and share it with others as we celebrate Valentines Day. This year the reminder of God's love for us, the reminder of God's creation of us, is on February 14th. Yes, Valentines Day is also Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the Lenten season. What better way to remember God's amazing love for us than for Ash Wednesday to fall on Saint Valentine's Day. There are several stories of St. Valentine and why we might celebrate his life on February 14th. The legend that seems most confirmed over several traditions and readings is that St. Valentine was imprisoned in Rome for ministering to Christians persecuted under the Roman Empire in the third century. According to an early tradition, Saint Valentine restored sight to the blind daughter of his jailer. Numerous later additions to the legend have better related it to the theme of love: tradition maintains that Saint Valentine performed weddings for Christian soldiers who were forbidden to marry by the Roman emperor; an 18th-century embellishment to the legend claims he wrote the jailer's daughter a letter signed "Your Valentine" as a farewell before his execution on February 14th.

No matter which legend is true, there seems to be a theme throughout all of the traditions that St. Valentine was all about spreading the Good News of the Gospel wherever he could and to whom ever would listen. How appropriate then on this Ash Wednesday, that we dedicate ourselves for forty days to remembering what God created us for, to do all we can to share God's love and hope wherever... however... and to whomever we can. What will that look for you this Lenten season? What will you take on, or give up, to draw you closer to God's love.

The ashes we will place on our heads this Valentines Day should humble us and be a reminder that we are God's creation. A creation that is made to share love, share hope and grow in faith every day of our lives. May this year's Valentines Day hold a different meaning and purpose for you as the ashes are placed on your forehead and the invitation to "Be My Valentine" is extended to each of us in the sharing of the bread and the cup at The Lord's Table.

Let us all live into the hope and love that is Ash Wednesday, Lent and Valentines Day.


If any children are interested in greeting or ushering see Kristin or Chris Wolfe!

STEWARDSHIP NOTES: The December, 2023 financial statements can be summarized as follows... Pines is a blessed church!

- 1. Pledge income for 12 months ended slightly (1%) ahead of budget. Non-pledge income exceeded budget by 50%! Both results are certainly an answer to prayer. Total income exceeded the budget by \$61,046.
- 2. Overall expenses were over budget for the year by 2% or \$10,203. An unplanned, unbudgeted plumbing repair costing over \$20,000 is the reason for the overage. Other committees were mostly underbudget for the year. The Missions committee chose to defer their spending of the Lovejoy/Kroger funds and those 2023 funds will be added to the 2024 budget for Missions.
- 3. Total Income was \$718,360; total expenses were \$677,496; leaving a positive Net Income of \$40,864 for 2023, a very strong performance for 2023.
- 4. As of year end, 2024 pledges received total \$560,102 from 80 families, an increase of 2% over pledges received for 2023.
- 5. The Sustaining Gift Fund, held at the Texas Presbyterian Foundation (TPF), rose to a value of \$781,135 by year end. The 1/1/2023 value was \$493,139. This increase reflects market gains, plus the addition of ERTC funds and a \$50,000 undesignated donation, both temporarily directed to the TPF fund by the Trustees, and a \$25,000 designated gift by a donor. This fund is an important asset for the church.
- 6. The Session approved a balanced budget for 2024 on Monday, January 22 with total income of \$718,700 and total expenses of \$718,610.

Session The Session met for its regular stated meeting on January 22. Here are some highlights:

- Session approved conducting the Annual Meetings of the Congregation and the Corporation after Worship on February 11, 2024. At the meetings, the Congregation will be asked to vote on terms of call for Rev. Gans, to elect a new trustee for a 3-year term, to elect members from the Congregation to serve on the 2024 Nominating Committee, and other actions that will be presented in a formal notice next week.
- Session approved the budget for 2024. The budget will be reviewed with the Congregation at the Annual Meeting.
- Session elected Shirley Bollich and Patsy Jackson as Ruling Elder Commissioners to the meeting of the Presbytery of New Covenant on March 16. A third commissioner will be elected at the February Session meeting.
- Dan Schafer was elected as Clerk of Session for a one-year term commencing March 1, 2024.
- Session approved the Christian Education Committee's proposed curricula: *Stranger Safety* for children's classes, *Twenty-Four Hours That Changed the World* as the Lenten Study, and a daily devotional titled *Local Pilgrim, A Wandering, Wondering Daily Devotional* for adults.
- Session approved the Worship Committee's nomination of Valerie Harelson to serve as Memorial Service Coordinator, and approved amendments to the Memorial Service Guidelines.

Are you looking for something you can do from home for the church?


We are looking to start back up with the Sojourners Group. This volunteer position would look for places for people in or connected to our church to go on trips in the Houston and surrounding areas.
