Pastor's Page

Grace and peace to you this Advent season,

As the old song says, this is the most wonderful time of year! I couldn't agree more. I love Advent with all its excitement and joy as we anxiously anticipate Christmas day and the great celebration of the birth of our Lord and Savior! This is the season where, often times, love abounds as we think about gifts we can give to loved ones and as we think about spending time with family and friends.

As we prepare to celebrate Jesus' birth, God coming to earth as a baby, I wonder if we actually think about how incredible this act really is. Think about it for a moment. God came to live among us, to walk with us, to work with us, to pray with us and to cry with us. God cares enough about you and me, and the rest of creation, that God came to show us what love really looks like and how it's lived out in this world. Thinking about this radical form of love got me thinking about a scripture we read during worship back in November. The scripture was Isaiah 65:17, For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. Even in Isaiah, God was telling the people something new was about to happen. Little did Isaiah's listeners realize that new thing was going to happen several hundred years later in a barn stall when Jesus was born. Jesus' birth represents that new thing Isaiah was talking about. Jesus represents the new heaven and the new earth. This new thing is what we celebrate every December 25th! We celebrate God doing a new thing and breaking into this world to reform our old way of living and to give us a new way that shows and shares love and mercy.

Doing a new thing is difficult, though, we're used to the old way. We're comfortable with how we've been living, how we've been working and how we've been treating God's children. I bet that's what the people of Jesus' time on earth were thinking too, "We don't need a new thing, we're fine just the way things are." My question is, if we're fine with the way things are, then why do we celebrate Christmas? Christmas is all about doing something new, even if that new thing is difficult and may make you, and maybe others, feel uncomfortable. Let's you and I really celebrate Christmas this year and do something new. Let's break with the way we've always done something and allow the fullness of Christ Jesus to enter into our hearts, lives, families and even our traditional celebrations. Let's shake up the world and truly celebrate the *New Thing* God is doing. Let's celebrate Emmanuel, God with us!

ORANGE CRANBERRY BREAD

Ingredients:

2 C Flour

1 C Sugar

1 1/2 tsp Baking powder

1/2 tsp. Baking Soda

1/4 C Butter (room temp)

1 C Orange juice

1 Tbsp Orange Zest

1 Egg

2 C fresh cranberries, cut in half

1/2 C Walnuts(or whatever nut you prefer) (optional)



Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Line 9" bread pan with parchment paper. Spray entire pan with cooking spray and set aside.

In a bowl combine flour, sugar, baking powder, salt and baking soda.

Add butter and mix until mixture is crumbly.

Using mixer slowly add orange juice, a little at a time until batter is smooth and creamy.

Add zest and egg and blend well.

Fold in cranberries and nuts

Pour mixture into prepared loaf pan and bake for 1 hour to 1 hour and 10 minutes--or until toothpick inserted into center comes out clean.

Let cool for 10 minutes, then remove from pan.
