YOUTH

What is going on in the books we don't typically read? And what does a book this old have to do with my life right now? We tackle these questions, and more, every Sunday. Our youth-focused approach centers on why the word of God, and the stories of God's people, matters in the lives of teenagers in the 21st century. Note: This class begins IN-PERSON on November 1st.

FAMILY-CLASS

For all God's children between the ages of 4 & 104! Classroom: W-12

Topic: This is an inter-generational class designed for families to attend together. We are digging into compassion this season – looking for examples of God's compassion in the Bible and wondering how we can lead more compassionate lives. We will act out some of the Bible stories, color and talk about how to connect the stories to real ways we can bring more compassion to our world. Note: This class begins IN-PERSON on November 1st.

NURSERY

For children under 4 years old.

Classroom: W-8

Topic: It might seem unusual to teach babies and toddlers, but these littlest ones are the youngest disciples and the most absorbent sponges. It is important for us that they, too, know God loves them! We use memory verses with hand motions, songs with Bible truths, and simple pictures to show the gospel. In this class, the youngest babes will begin to know God's love and start praying to our amazing God. Note: This class begins IN-PERSON on November 1st.



Grace & peace to you,

As we enter November, I am thankful the warm temperatures and stifling humidity of summer are finally giving way to cooler breezes and a little less humidity. These cooler temps turn our thoughts to exciting activities of fall, Thanksgiving, and dare I say Christmas. When thinking of the season of Thanksgiving my mind often turns to the Psalms that often speak of the thanksgiving we have in God's love and commitment to us. Sherwood Christmas Store 2020

Although December is a few months away and our day to day lives continue with some uncertainty, our presence within the lives of the Sherwood Elementary students is more important now than ever. The impact you have made on the Sherwood families in years past will continue this year but in a different format. Despite the changes, our love and dedication for our families remain stronger than ever.

The feedback from our traditional Christmas Store allowing families to have ownership in the process has been extremely well received. Current health concerns have challenged us all in many ways and, we cannot risk the health of our volunteers and the Sherwood families using this same format. Traditionally parents selected and purchased gifts for their children at a large discount. The money paid for the gifts by the parents was returned in the form of a large food basket. The basket contained a gift card for perishable items, along with non-perishable items for a Christmas meal and several meals to bridge the food gap during the holidays. This year the Sherwood families will be given gifts selected by Pines members. Our plans are to continue with the purchase and delivery of food. There will be no cost to the families. The Missions Committee is standing on Faith that the donations of gifts, approval of a grant, and other financial support will come sustain this effort. The Missions Committee along with the assistance of Bonnie Reyes, CIS Manager at Sherwood, has determined there are 100 children ranging from birth through high school that need Christmas gifts. We need your help in creating the magical experience the families of Sherwood have come to love. There are several options on how to support the Sherwood Christmas Store.

"Hello from Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services, Child & Family Worker, Lacey Rivers! It has been six months since our agency began to take precautions regarding COVID-19 and in our department, this meant a transition from providing in-home services to virtual sessions for our clients. Although it has been a learning experience for all, I am happy to share that we have continued to successfully provide services to children and families in need, while also getting creative! I am currently working with 12-15 families and providing services such as TBRI parenting sessions, telehealth therapy sessions for stress management and emotional support and providing resources as many battle job losses and financial struggles. For many clients it has been a blessing to be able to utilize technology to meet via telehealth or simply by phone. We have been able to assist in providing needs such as school supplies, baby essentials, food assistance and more. I have made many trips to client's homes and left needs upon their doorsteps while getting smiles and waves through the windows. I have received feedback that it is comforting to have support and to see our faces though we are unable to meet in person. A recent way of remaining connected with clients through this time was by making "back to school" baskets with inspirational quotes, motivational letters, school supplies and a treat (or two J) to let our families know we are thinking about them and supporting them through this journey! I am grateful each day to be able to continue to serve like Jesus and assist families in finding their strengths and to remain together and connected. We continue to pray for the safety and health of all who are navigating through the pandemic and are grateful for every prayer and donation to be able to continue to serve our community."

FORWARD TOGETHER IN FAITH

In mid-October I realized that I was responsible for two November newsletter articles – the monthly article on the availability of Stephen Ministers at Pines to serve those with emotional needs AND a special article to remind you of our ongoing "Forward Together in Faith" stewardship campaign, especially some upcoming events.

The first stewardship event will occur on **Sunday**, **November 8** when we will have an **outdoor** "ice cream social" after the worship service while observing physical distancing. The goal of our "**Safe Sundae Social**" is to remind us of the joy inherent in the fellowship we enjoy when we gather together. For those who do not feel comfortable in gathering, we will also have a "drive-by" option where we would be excited to share a smile, a warm greeting, and a cold ice cream snack for those who drive by the covered entry way in the south parking lot off of West Bough between 11:30 am-12:30 pm.

On **Sunday, November 15**, you may either attend worship and bring your pledge card forward during the service or you may "drive-by" the church using the south parking lot off of West Bough and leave the card with someone who will be standing under the covered entrance between 9:30-11:30am. Regardless of the choice you make, we will share a breakfast taco with everyone as a small token of appreciation for your willingness to join us in moving **Forward Together in Faith on** "**Taco and a Pledge Sunday**". **Of course, pledge cards can also be mailed to the church at any time.**

As I thought about this article, I remembered a portion of one of the Guiding Principles we developed to guide our efforts in conducting the "Forward Together in Faith" campaign. That Principle states we will "also use the campaign to begin efforts to promote healing and bring people together". As I reflected on those words, I realized that they also apply to what Stephen Ministers attempt to do. They have undergone 50 hours of formal training, as well as countless hours of continuing education, to become equipped to facilitate healing through a commitment to come together with those suffering emotional pain and walk beside them.

By this time, I hope you have viewed the impactful video which featured the Rev. Bill Willis' journey with a Pines Stephen Minister, as well as the loving outreach of this congregation in welcoming him into our family after he lost his beloved wife over six years ago. It is a powerful testimony of what can happen when people move **Forward Together in Faith,** and can be viewed on the Pines website.



STEWARDSHIP UPDATE

- 1. Pledge income is below target for 9 months operations—at the end of the first nine months (75%) of the year, 65% of pledge income is received. Non-pledge income is well below budget with only 34% of non-pledge income received at the end of the first 9 months.
- 2. Committee expenses are below budget expectations.
- 3. YTD Total Income is \$490,664; YTD total expenses are \$514,896; with Net Income thru August at \$-24,232.
- 4. PPP loan funds (\$58,925) are expected to help address the non-pledge income deficit when the loan is forgiven.



Session Meeting Notes

The Session met for its regular Stated meeting on October 26. Here are some highlights:

- Approved a Worship Committee proposal to hold outdoor worship services in the back parking lot beginning November 1 at 5:00 p.m. The services will utilize a low-power FM transmitter to allow participants to remain in their cars.
- Heard that while pledge income in October is up, the year-to-date shortfall in total income continues.
- Received an update on the stewardship campaign and presented 2021 pledges.
- Heard an update on the progress of resuming in-person gatherings, including strong adult Sunday School attendance.
- Elected commissioners to the November 21 meeting of the Presbytery of New Covenant.

Last week while talking with Bonnie, Communities in School at Sherwood, she mentioned that most students have resumed in person school. However, that created a need due to COIVD restrictions. School Rule: students cannot take supplies from one classroom to another thus the need for additional markers, colors, glue sticks and composition notebooks. Pines filled the need. 120 glue sticks, 80 markers, colors and notebooks delivered! Bonnie was again very grateful for the partnership between Pines and SWE.

On another note, while talking with Bonnie, I learned that the Walmart at Westview and Beltway 8 offered Bonnie school supplies. She was told to take whatever they had in bulk that would fit in her car. She was able to get folders, spirals, pencils, pencil bags, note cards, binders, paper and several others items. It's nice to know our local Walmart is supporting SWE.
