**Volunteers Needed** – Would you like to get more involved in a Church activity but don't feel you have much available time? The Worship Committee has just the spot for you to serve. The committee is looking for someone (or several people) to be responsible for preparing the communion elements for a three-month period. Our available period is the months of July – September. Duties entail, filling 80 - 100 communion cups with juice, prior to the Sunday morning Communion Service. This can be done Friday or Saturday and the trays stored in the kitchen refrigerator. The Communion gluten-free bread is being prepared by Linda Aldred and Laurie Conners and will be stored in the freezer. Enough bread to serve 100 people should be taken out and placed in the refrigerator to that prior to the Sunday service. Prior to Sunday, you need to purchase a round loaf of bread for the Communion Table. On Communion Sunday, the bread is put in the trays, the juice is added to the pitcher and the loaf of bread is lightly scored on the bottom so Andy can rip it apart easily. The juice and bread trays are placed on the front table with the top covered; tongs are placed behind the bread trays; the loaf of bread is covered with a white cloth napkin and the pitcher and chalice are also placed on the table along with the bread. The church circles assist with cleaning up Communion after the service. If interested, please contact Connie Sipp. All expenses incurred will be reimbursed and training and printed instruction will be provided.

# Pastor's Page

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior,

Have you ever really thought about that greeting? What does it mean to greet and welcome someone in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus the Christ? When I think of greeting or welcoming someone in the name of Jesus the Christ it means I open my arms, I welcome you with an open heart, open mind. I welcome you as an equal without any conditions.

When we, as a church, welcome people to our worshiping community Jesus should be our example of welcome and greeting. We should be thankful when we have guests sitting in our pew, when we have crying babies, when we have exuberant children and teens, when we have people who maybe look, dress or smell differently than us. When these people are in our pews then we are a growing congregation, and we should do all we can to make sure these guests know we are truly glad they are with us.

The Gospels are full of examples of Jesus' never ending offer of welcome, mercy, grace and love. The neat thing about Jesus' offer of welcome is that it wasn't just offered on the Sabbath. The example of Jesus' welcome should be seen in everything we do as individuals and as a church. We should never be the ones who point fingers, who whisper under our breath, or who shew someone away.

Several years ago, a church member sent me an article about the act of welcoming people in church. The article centered on a welcome sign posted on the doors of St. Clements Church in Essex, England. This sign stands not only as a welcome to all who stop by, but also a reminder to the membership of who is welcomed by God. I have enclosed the words of the welcome sign here as a reminder to all of us about what it means when we say, and embody, the opening statement of our vision and mission statement that say, "Pines is a joyful Christian community that welcomes all."

"We extend a special welcome to those who are single, married, divorced, widowed, gay, confused, filthy rich, comfortable, or dirt poor. We extend a special welcome to those who are crying new-borns, skinny as a rake or could afford to lose a few pounds. You're welcome if you are Old Leigh, New Leigh, Not Leigh, or just passing by.

We welcome you if you can sing like Pavarotti or can't carry a note in a bucket. You're welcome here if you're 'just browsing,' just woke up or just got out of prison. We don't care if you're more Christian than the Archbishop of Canterbury, or haven't been in church since little Jack's christening.

We extend a special welcome to those who are over 60 but not grown up yet, and to teenagers who are growing up too fast. We welcome keep-fit mums, football dads, starving artists, tree-huggers, latte-sippers, vegetarians, junk-food eaters. We welcome those who are in recovery or still addicted. We welcome you if you're having problems or you're down in the dumps or if you don't like 'organized religion.' We've been there too!

# Stewardship



### **STEWARDSHIP NOTES:**

- 1. Total Income remains strong for the first half of the year, with Pledge Income, Non-pledge Income and Interest Income all exceeding budget expectations. Pledge Income is \$266,931, 51% of budget for first half of year. Non-pledge income is \$64,565, 64% of budget for first half of year. Interest income already exceeds the full year budget by \$867.
- 2. Total expenses remain underbudget: \$279,553 spent, 42% of budget for first half of year. Property income from building use is offsetting expenses ahead of schedule. Strong demand for electricity and air conditioning are expected to increase costs over the next few months.
- 3. Net Income is \$69,164, well above expectation for this point in the year. We are blessed!
