AUTHENTIC DIALOGUE



I recently visited with a hospital patient who I have gotten to know because he continues a multi-year battle with cancer. At the end of our visit he said, "Phil, thanks for the authentic dialogue today." The patient's description of our time of sharing reminded me of the Stephen Minister continuing education session on April 24 where we listened to a TED TALK on Effective Communication.

As I researched various descriptions of "authentic dialogue", I discovered several similarities between those definitions and the effective communication steps

which were discussed on April 24, including the following:

LISTEN to understand and not to reply to something that is shared by another. Remind yourself that every conversation is an opportunity to learn because everyone knows something you do not.

LISTEN in a non-judgmental way so that the other person will feel free to express themselves openly and candidly.

When **LISTENING**, let go of the thoughts which come into your mind because they will lead you to stop listening.

When **LISTENING**, be open to different viewpoints and perspectives rather than framing comments to convince the other person that your views are correct.

One cannot **LISTEN** and multi-task, so decide which activity you will focus on.

Use open-ended questions beginning with Who? What? When? Where? How? and Why? The more in-depth responses you will receive will enrich your learning/LISTENING experience.

It is obvious that the most important key to Effective Communications is **Effective Listening**. This is one of the key tenets of the Stephen Minister training program. Stephen Ministers are trained to use all of these effective communication tools to create an environment where "authentic dialogue" can take place on a regular basis. And when that happens, healing can occur and hope for a better future can be regained.

Each of us treasures those people in our lives with whom we can enjoy authentic dialogue, and sometimes that is with a family member, a long-time friend or sometimes we need someone who is willing to make a longer term commitment to listen and have authentic dialogue in order to help with a challenge. If you think a Stephen Minister could serve in the latter role, feel free to contact either Ann Guerra or Phil Wetz for a **confidential** discussion on what that would entail. In the meantime, take advantage of the opportunities for authentic dialogue as they will enrich your life.



STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

- 1. Total Income is just slightly ahead of 50% of the budget with 50% of the year underway. Pledge income exceeds expectation by \$30,000, while non-pledge income is almost \$23,000 under budget through the first half of the year.
- 2. Total expenses are right on target at the halfway point.
- 3. Net Income is a positive \$7.422.
- 4. The Sustaining Gift Fund endowment balance (held at Texas Presbyterian Foundation) at the end of second quarter is \$966,600.

During the predawn hours of July 4th the Texas Hill Country was hit with devastating floods that wiped out camps, homes, businesses, and took the lives of over 100 children of God. Although, over 4 hours away this tragedy strikes us here in Houston as well. Many of you have connections to that area and to victims of the flood. I can't imagine the pain you and those along the Guadalupe River are experiencing right now. It is in times like these when we lean into our faith and plead with God to help us. That help from God comes in many forms. We witness God's love and support when hundreds of first responders descend on the area to make an immediate impact. We witness God's love and support with the countless volunteers who come to provide food, counseling, willing arms and legs to move things and muck out homes. We especially see God's love and support when faith communities gather together to pray and send financial support. The Session and I want Pines to be part of God's love and support for our Hill Country brothers and sisters by collecting a Special Offering specifically for Hill Country recovery.

The Session has decided to designate Team Rubicon as the recipient of our collected funds. We became very familiar with Team Rubicon when we housed 40 team members for over six weeks following Hurricane Beryl. This wholly volunteer group is one of the first on the ground following a disaster and they stay many weeks following to make sure their work is done. Saturday night stargazing at the George Observatory, located in Brazos Bend State Park



Lunch Lady Brownies

Ingredients:

For the Brownie Base:

- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, melted
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 4 large eggs
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1/4 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 cup milk

For the Frosting:

- 1/2 cup (1 stick) unsalted butter, softened
- 1/4 cup milk
- 1/4 cup unsweetened cocoa powder
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 4 cups powdered sugar
- Pecans (optional) to taste

Instructions:

- 1. Preheat your oven to 350°F (175°C). Grease or line a 9×13-inch baking pan with parchment paper.
- 2. Prepare the brownie base: In a large bowl, whisk together the melted butter and granulated sugar until smooth. Add the eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Stir in the vanilla extract.
- 3. In a separate bowl, combine the flour, cocoa powder, salt, and baking powder. Gradually add the dry ingredients to the wet mixture, alternating with the milk, and stir until well combined. The batter will be thick.
- 4. Bake the brownies: Pour the brownie batter into the prepared baking pan and spread it out evenly. Bake for 25-30 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted into the center comes out clean. Allow the brownies to cool completely in the pan.
- 5. Prepare the frosting: In a medium saucepan, melt the butter over medium heat. Stir in the milk and cocoa powder, and bring the mixture to a simmer. Remove from heat and stir in the vanilla extract.
- 6. Gradually add the powdered sugar, mixing until smooth and creamy. Adding pecans here is good too!
- 7. Frost the brownies: Once the brownies have cooled, spread the frosting evenly over the top of the brownies.
- 8. Cut and serve: Slice the brownies into squares and serve. Enjoy the rich, fudgy texture and sweet, creamy frosting!

Important Info...

In the event that the doors are not open for your group, please leave a note on the door to ask group members to call your cell phone for entry. Every group leader should have an entry card to come into the building. If you do not, please contact Cindy in the church office to
