





STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

- Pledge income for 2 months is slightly ahead of budget. Non-pledge income received through February is 1/3 of the year's budget due to unexpected early gifts.
- Overall expenses were underbudget for two months and lower than the first two months of 2022.
- Total Income was \$138,036; total expenses were \$103,616; leaving a Net Income of \$34,420 for February, a great start for the year.



Session The Session met for its regular stated meeting on March 27. Here are some highlights:

• Session approved for the Explorer's Sunday School curriculum the Frontline documentary "From Jesus to the Christ, The First Christians, Parts I and II."

- Session approved the Worship Committee's motion to increase fees charged for a wedding held at Pines, to \$1,775 for members and to \$2,225 for non-members.
- The Property Committee reported that the Daughters of the American Revolution have donated funds that will allow Pines to purchase a new icemaker. Pines' old icemaker has been out of commission for many months. Leslie Friedrich brought Pines' need to the DAR's attention.
- An "Opportunity Sunday" will be held before and after Worship on May 7, where all Pines' committees will showcase the work that each committee performs, and invite new members to join.
- At the Session/Staff retreat in early March, Session identified a priority need to increase outreach within the community surrounding Pines. The Missions Committee is developing plans for events Thursday evenings to invite the community into Pines which will pique the community's interest in what Pines has to offer.
- In light of recent events at church facilities nation wide, Session approved hiring an armed uniformed off-duty police officer to be present on the Pines' campus during Easter Worship service.



Is Discipleship Enough?

A disciple is a student or follower of a particular person. But being a disciple (discipleship) is the second phase in a three-phase process that begins with believing. The Bible says Peter and John were teaching the people about the Good News of Jesus and "... many who heard the message believed; so the number of men who believed grew to about five thousand" (Acts 4:4).

As those believers started digging deeper into their newfound belief in Jesus, they transitioned from being believers into being disciples. There would be those who wanted to dig deeper into the Good News. Others might want to know more about Jesus' miracles. Some may have been intrigued by the way Jesus and other disciples challenged the religious power structure of the day. But there would also be many who became disciples because they had an unmet spiritual longing.

Many people today try to satisfy their spiritual longing through self-help books, attending personal development seminars, or engaging in mental and physical spiritual practices. But Christians know that spiritual longing can only be satisfied by a close and personal relationship with Jesus. After all, Jesus came that we may have life and have it abundantly (Jn 10:10).

Our discipleship journey might include worship and adult Sunday school. We might join a Bible study, participate in religious retreats, or be active in a home-based small group. Before we know it, we will have:

Found a place where we can associate with some nice people,

Found a place where we can enjoy meaningful and uplifting worship services,

Found a place where we can dig deeper into our faith,

Found a place where we can get our kids baptized,

Found a place that can help us teach the faith to our kids,

Found a place where our kids can get married when the time comes,

Found a place that will help meet our emotional and spiritual needs through the various stages of our life, and

Found a place where someone will preach our memorial service when that time comes.

Sadly, though, some disciples never get beyond that "found a place..." stage. When they get stuck in that stage, they miss the opportunity to spread their spiritual wings and transition from being disciples into being *apostles*.

"One of those days Jesus went out to a mountainside to pray, and spent the night praying to God. When morning came, he called his disciples to him and chose twelve of them, whom he also designated apostles:"

(Luke 6:12-13)

The word apostle comes from the Greek word for being "sent out." For many months, The Twelve had been following Jesus and had been discipled (taught) by him. They may not have known it at the time, but they were being prepared to drive out impure spirits... (MT 10:1); heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy, and drive out demons (MT 10:8).

Before you push back saying, "Whoa, I'm not up to doing that kind of kingdom work," remember that the original apostles were ordinary people just like you and me. And just as he did with those original apostles, Jesus has been preparing you and me to leave the comfort of the "found a place" church building and go into the world and make disciples. We started as believers, become disciples, and now we are being called to be apostles. Are you ready to be an apostle?
