



STEWARDSHIP UPDATE:

- 1. Total Income for the ten months is \$548,574, 79% of Total Income budgeted for the year. This is below target (83%) for this time of the year.
- 2. Expenses for the nine months are \$569,115, 82% of Total Expenses budgeted for the year and right on target. Most committees (except Property) are under budget at this time of the year.
- 3. In looking at our top 3 expenditure areas, Staff, Property and Missions, Property is over budget for this time of year, Staff is under budget and Missions is about on target. The Property expenses are net of preschool payments and use of the capital reserve fund for gym air conditioning replacement. Property spending is on pace to overspend the budget fairly significantly, which is a concern, but hopefully will be mostly mitigated by Staff underbudget expenses.
- 4. Total Expenses exceed Total Income for the ten-month period, generating a negative Net Income of (\$20,541). While a negative net income is concerning, we don't know yet where we'll end up at the end of the year, based on ten months of income and expenses.
- 5. Pines' PPP2 loan was fully forgiven by the SBA during the last few day of October. \$59,862

Session Meeting Notes

The Session met for its regular stated meeting on November 22. Here are some highlights:

- Session welcomed and accepted Steven (Steve) Chaney and Antoinette (Nette) Anderson as new members of Pines.
- The Worship Committee announced there will be two Christmas Eve Services at 5 and 7 pm.
- Session approved restarting the passing of offering plates beginning December 5. Fellowship pads are already in the pews.
- Session and the Stewardship Committee thanked Susan and Mark Babineck for leading this year's Stewardship Campaign. Pledges received so far are somewhat behind last year at this time, but 8 brand new pledges have been received!

Pastor's Page

Greetings to you in the name of the Christ Child,

I pray you had a wonderful Thanksgiving surrounded by some family or friends. Thanksgiving has traditionally been a time to welcome people into our homes or join others in theirs. For the past thirteen years my family and I have spent Thanksgiving with our very close friends in Dallas, but we're not the only ones there for the meal. The dinner guests, which number between twenty to thirty, include extended family and close friends. The preparations are intense, but what's more spectacular is the hospitality my dear friend offers. She makes sure everyone knows where everything is, makes sure everyone has enough, and if there is a fresh face in the group that year, she makes sure they are loved on and made to feel like part of the family.

For several years, as I sat around my friend's table, I couldn't help but be aware that hospitality is paramount for her. I then began to think about the church and how we might think about hospitality, especially during the Advent and Christmas season. I once read an article about a study on church hospitality during Christmas. The study, taken in the late 1990's said that three out of four Americans attend church sometime during the Christmas season, and almost thirty percent attend church more frequently during the holidays. That number might be a little high these days, but it still shows that attendance increases during this season. The article says there will be:

- family members from out of town,
- people thinking about making a change in the coming year after Christmas
- seekers longing for the familiarity of Christmas traditions they grew up with
- curiosity driven consumers seeking the comforts of beautiful Christmas music

Even in this COVID world we still expect to see many first-time visitors and guests for our Christmas events and worship services. Let's be sure to extend a warm hand of Christian hospitality, in hopes that they will want to return next week, and the week after that, and even make Pines their church home. Here are some hospitality suggestions as we enter this marvelous season:

- Take the time to greet people you don't know.
- First-time visitors and guests aren't familiar with the layout of the building, so please be ready to help with directions to the Sanctuary, rest rooms, childcare, and children's worship bags.
- You might even want to offer to provide a personal escort or guided tour.
- The sanctuary will be more crowded than usual, so please leave seating space at the aisles for people who arrive after you. Let's not make visitors and guests crawl across other people.
- If someone is sitting in the seat you normally occupy, just look for a different seat. In fact, let's plan to look for seats near the front, and leave the rear seats for visitors and guests wherever possible.
- Visitors and guests will not be familiar with our Sanctuary and worship habits. Offer to help if you see someone who looks as if they may not be sure what's going on.

This moment is the best time of year to demonstrate the friendliness of our amazing family of faith. Let's take the initiative and invite our friends, co-workers and neighbors to enjoy the hospitality, love and faith of this remarkable congregation. May we welcome others with the same open arms with which Christ welcomes us!

Our "Forward Together in Faith" campaign culminated in Stewardship Sunday last month, where many of us in the worship service turned in our pledge cards and prayed over them as we look ahead – forward – to the promise of 2022 and the future.

If you look around, many houses of worship have similar dates on their calendars but they often go by different names. Admittedly I have some bias here, but I really like how we frame it compared to some other popular names:

- Pledge Sunday: Sure, we turn in our pledges, but that's really just the promise to give in the future. It accurately describes the function, but it stops short of the goal.
- Commitment Sunday: A stronger word than "pledge", commitment gets us closer, but once again it simply goes as far as a promise to follow through later. At least it also signifies a binding relationship between the giver and the church that – hopefully – beyond writing checks authorizing or debits.

On November 14 we celebrated Stewardship Sunday, our spin on the concept. While many of us turned in pledge cards to let the church know of our financial commitment, we use a name that transcends merely the promise of the congregation members to the church.

Rather, Stewardship Sunday conveyed a promise in the opposite direction. While we pledge to give to Pines, the church vows in return to be faithful stewards of those resources for God. Whether it be salaries for our valued staff, repairs and improvements on our facilities, utility bills to keep us warm or (more often) cool or our myriad mission projects, Pines works hard to be a trusted steward.

Stewardship Sunday is also just a beginning. While we had a robust response, we still seek pledge commitments from members who have not yet turned their cards in so we can plan out the year to come ... and beyond. Pines stands at the ready to continue its tradition of stewardship. Please prayerfully consider assisting the effort if you haven't already, and thanks to all who trust the church to venture forward together, in faith.

Christ caring for people through people STEPHEN MINISTRY

Christ carring for people through people STEPHEN MINISTRY TRAUMA — WHAT IT IS AND WHAT CAN BE DONE

STEPHEN On October 28, several Stephen Ministers joined Joy Kreider for a seminar on trauma. Joy has done extensive study on the topic and has worked with trauma victims as well as trained Caregivers in how to support those whose lives have involved traumatic incident(s).

Joy helped us to understand that trauma can occur from: (1) a single incident such as the death of a loved one or a severe accident; (2) repeated events such as physical and emotional abuse; and (3) varied and multiple events such as those inherent in a toxic relationship. The possible responses by victims of trauma are too numerous to mention but can include: exhaustion; fear; withdrawal; confusion; anger; sadness; sleep disturbance; anxiety or poor concentration.

In extreme cases, an individual dealing with trauma may respond with either **freezing** as they are so traumatized that they can no longer perform basic daily tasks or **fighting** where the individual is so scared and threatened that they consistently react in an antagonistic fashion. Fortunately, these are extreme cases and, in those instances, seeking professional help (e.g. a support group or a therapist with trauma training) is advised.

In less severe cases, Joy made a number of helpful suggestions on how caregivers can support those who have experienced trauma. Examples include:

Identify activities that help a person feel calm (e.g. listening to music, drawing, praying, exercising, singing)

Connecting with others through talking, writing notes, social media, or getting together


Developing hobbies which provide joy and a sense of calmness

Deep breathing exercises

Asking someone to simply be physically present with you if conversation is not an option

Although all Stephen Ministers engage in 50 hours of training, the Stephen Ministers at Pines engage in monthly continuing education activities, such as Joy's seminar, to continue efforts to enhance our ability to serve and care for others. Our goal is to listen and interact with people who are dealing with any type of life challenge in an attempt to partner with the Holy Spirit in assisting that individual to work through the issues and identify ways to develop a more gratifying life.




"It's Gonna Happen"
