Dear Pines family of faith,

Happy Spring! I pray your Holy Week and Easter encounters were meaningful to you this year, and that they made a lasting impact on you and your faith. I was so thankful for the choir's cantata presentation on Palm Sunday. The choir worked extremely hard to bring you a meaningful and well sounding worship experience through music and words. The cantata, followed by the amazing lunch in Fellowship Hall, was a wonderful way to kick off Holy Week as we went from the joyous celebration of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, to the excruciating pain of the crucifixion, followed by the joyous sounds of Halleluiah's on Easter morning. I was so grateful for our church family who came together as a body of believers to offer worship and fellowship to our community. I was excited to see the visitors who joined us at the Easter Egg Hunt and Sunrise Service in Bendwood Park on Easter weekend. 
PRAYER PAL POTLUCK COMING!

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE:

The February 2024 financial statements can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Total income received through February was \$163,553. Pledge income was \$137,875 and unpledged income was \$11,370. Several members paid their entire pledge in January giving us a great start to the year. Interest income also exceeds the budgeted amount for 2 months.
- 2. Overall expenses were on target for two months of the year at \$124,959.
- 3. Net income through February was \$38,594.

What's in a Lenten Devotional? By Ann Guerra

DIFIFUN If you didn't get a chance to read this year's Lenten Devotionals, they were based on everyday places and encouraging the authors to look deeper. As the editor put it, "it was a sacred exercise in attending to whatever God lays before us in our lives and our communities."

As the authors carried us to a popular bar, the trails of Red Rock National Conservation Area, a landfill, a library, their favorite hamburger spot, on a city bus ride and so many other places, I was able to share the simple stories and share God's message of compassion, companionship, intentionality, and love. I will admit, they were not as "deep in scripture" as other years. Because of that, I found myself out in the world sharing them with others- with people that I had no idea where they were on their faith journey or if they even had faith. Some of the conversations that were triggered were so touching.

Reading the devotionals, I opened my eyes a little wider, cleaned out my ears, and softened my heart as I entered grocery stores, schools, airports, restaurants, and hospitals this Lenten season. When I listen to the news, I have a hard time seeing a world that loves each other, but when I look closely at what's right in front of me, I sure can.

The devotion on March 17 talks of a family needing a translator to express the needs of their sick baby, a woman in a hijab and an unhoused man all gathering together in a hospital ER where the author writes, "No one is turned away." From North to South and from East to West we all deserve to be accepted, seen and loved.
