

Pastor's Page

Greetings in Christ's name,

Over the past several months I was blessed to gather with small groups of Pines family members in homes, and here at church, to learn about each other and hear why each of us has made Pines our family of faith. Each session was scheduled to last an hour and a half, but usually lasted longer due to the wonderful conversations and the connections that were being made. As Presbyterians, we believe a connectional church is a healthy church. A connectional church is healthy because its people seek to be in relationship with each other... and others outside its walls.

My biggest learning from my small group experience was that most people returned, and eventually joined Pines, because of its family feel and its members desire to be in relationship with you. Many folks talked about how they would attend once or just drive past the larger churches searching for a place where almost everyone knew you name, a church with someone like a Harry Loose.

I shared my learnings with the Vision and Planning Committee, and we talked about what that meant for the future of Pines and its identity. We looked into scripture and were guided by Jesus' response to the lawyer in Luke 10:27. After much discussion we felt we were describing what many of us felt was a neighborhood/neighborly church. The committee thought it would be wise to ask you, the Pines family, what you thought a neighborhood/ neighborly church looked like and if you felt Pines is or should be a neighborhood/ neighborly church. During two worship services in late July, we asked you those very questions on a very brief questionnaire. Your responses were appreciated, and the results to those questions are on page 7 of this newsletter.

As follow up to the survey, and the Vision and Planning's meeting, a Session retreat was planned for late July to see if we want our vision for 2020 to be a neighborhood/ neighborly church. During our time together we brainstormed how we can live into being a neighborhood/neighborly church by going out and inviting in. Two big ideas were solidified as ways to reach out and be that neighborhood church. "Back to Church Sunday" in September and offering an Alpha Bible Study beginning in January. Both programs are opportunities for us to reach out to those around us and welcome them into our family. Many other ideas were talked about and sent to specific committees for discussion on how to be implemented.


I continue to be excited about where we are going as a family of faith. You are an amazing group of faithful people who continue to love beyond our walls. I know God is at work at Pines!


Youth Happenings!




Stewardship

Mid-Year Financial Review through 6/30/19

• Halfway through the fiscal year, both pledge and non-pledge income received are at 50%, right on track.

- Other Income received (interest income and ATT cell tower income) are also as budgeted.
- Expenses overall are slightly below budget at this point in the year.

• Major activities funded during the first half of the year include: Congregational Meeting and Lunch, Women's retreat, Go Texan Day, New signage and brand materials, Session Retreat, Web site improvements, ROAR VBS for 100+ children, Camp Pines summer program, parents Date night in April, Easter activities, Shepherding group activities, PDA shelter set up, Follies performance and dinner, and multiple hands on mission projects (Street Reach, Party with a Purpose, Summer Camp



in early June, TAAP)

• Building maintenance has included A/C repair, landscaping, Butterfly installation, 2 Eagle Scout projects, painting large white outdoor cross, renegotiation of our phone, internet and electricity contracts, resulting in cost savings.

STEPHEN MINISTRY

A Sense of a Goose

Next fall, when you see geese heading south for the winter, flying along in "V" formation, you might consider what science has discovered as to why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71 percent greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own. People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going more quickly and easily, because they are traveling on the thrust of one another.

When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone—and quickly gets back in to formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front.

If we have as much sense as a goose, we will stay in formation with those people who are headed the same way we are.

When the head goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point.

It is sensible to take turns doing demanding jobs, whether with people or with geese flying south.

Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

What messages do we give when we honk from behind?

Finally—and this is important---when a goose gets sick or is wounded by gunshot, and falls out of formation, two other geese fall out with the goose and follow it down to lend help and protection. They stay with the fallen goose until it is able to fly or until it dies; and only then do they launch out on their own, or with another formation to catch up with their group. If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by each other like that.
