

Pastor's Page

He is Risen! He is Risen Indeed!

Isn't that GREAT news! The season after Easter is such a wonderful time of year. The season brings with it a freshness, new beginnings, and new life. You can sense people's excitement as the days get longer and warmer. We sense the coming of summer, and the earth begins to bear more and more beautiful colors as flowers begin to grow and bloom.

This past Easter, as I enjoyed the lilies in the Sanctuary, I thought how fresh and welcoming the lilies made this house of God appear. I also went out to the columbarium/ memorial garden and just sat there for a few moments. As I sat there, I realized how the peacefulness of the garden reminded me of God's presence. I was amazed how fresh flowers and trickling water made such a difference in the way I felt about entering our campus. Our Easter faith needs to be like these flowers and the garden. The flowers are like Evangelism 101. A flower's beautiful colors draw people, and animals, to them to enjoy the color and nectar they provide. We may then go and tell others about how beautiful these flowers are, and they will come and see. Those people may come and bring others, and awed by their beauty they may wish to plant some of their own. Do you see how this can be seen as basic Christian evangelism? The sweet nectar and beauty of the flower is our Lord and Savior, and we are the ones who take the nectar of the message to the world and share the sweetness of Christ with others.

Like the flowers the Memorial Garden draws people in, not necessarily by its beauty, but by its peacefulness and its living water. One dry day a few months ago I saw three birds drinking from the fountain. This was marvelous! The garden reminds me of our amazing God. Our God who offers peace and solace. Our God who offers refreshment and living water to a dry people.

I pray that, as we enter these new days following the resurrection, we will use the flowers and the garden as reminders of our life-giving, amazing Lord who reaches out, gives new life, and refreshes a dry people.

Books Between Kids serves Houston's at-risk children by providing them with books to build their own home libraries.



- Approved a Letter of Transfer for Katherine Allison to First Presbyterian Church, Durham, NC.
- Approved a grant request to presbytery for the 2026 Feed My Starving Children MOBILEPACK.
- Approved a memorial service for Bettie Lade Lehman, mother of Mike Lade, on June 28.
- Approved adult curriculum motions from the Christian Education Committee.
- Received a report that pledge and non-pledge income are ahead of plan for the year to date.

- Total income received through January 31 was \$238,426 (33% of budget, ahead of target.) Pledge income was \$194,763 and unpledged income was \$24,259. Interest income was \$3,414, slightly behind projections.
- 2. Overall expenses were almost on target at \$197,208 (27% of budget).
- 3. Net income through March was \$41,218.

Did you know we have amazing and wonderful volunteers on the Session here at Pines? Our "Get to Know Your Staff" was so very well received that we decided to begin a "Get to Know Your Session" and this is month one as we explore a fun way to get to know them a little bit better. If you are familiar with the " 'Stro Poll" that comes up on the screen during every Astros game, then you know that they list 4 fun facts about an Astro; you can text in and guess who it is. Along those same lines, we are going to list a few fun facts about our Session members and ask you to participate by guessing who you think it might be.

We will continue this process for several months as we discover interesting things about our Session volunteers. The answers will be listed during the last month in the Newsletter.

1. Can you guess who this person is?

They love the color pink and they also love to do anything involved with crafting. He/she also loves to do anything that might be involved with dogs. They really love the movie *Gone With the Wind*. They read the book 20-30 times as a teenager and early adult. Danish Puff Pastry

A layered puff pastry topped with a sweet frosting, almonds, and cherries!

Ingredients:

Short crust Base 1 stick salted butter chilled, 1 cup all purpose flour spooned and leveled

- Choux 1 cup all purpose flour, 1 stick salted butter, 1 cup water, 1 teaspoon almond extract, 3 eggs
- **Frosting** 1 stick salted butter softened, 2 cups confectioner's sugar see notes 1 teaspoons almond extract or vanilla extract
- **Topping** sliced almonds, maraschino cherries destemmed and sliced in half **Instructions:**

Make the short crust base

Pre-heat oven to 350 degrees or 325 degrees convection.

Line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Tip: Use a little bit of butter or cooking spray to keep the sheet in place. Add flour to a medium sized bowl.

Cube butter and add to bowl with flour. With a pastry cutter or fork, cut butter into flour until all of the butter is well combined. You'll know it's cut in well when you can easily form 2 evenly sized rough balls of dough and it all sticks together.

Add each dough ball to the cookie sheet. Use your hands to form each pile of dough into a long flat strip approximately 12 inches long and 3 inches wide. Set aside.

Make Choux

Add water and butter to a small to medium sized saucepan and heat on medium and bring water to a boil while the butter melts. Be sure to watch the water so that it does not boil over. If it does, you will need to start again. Once boiling, add the 1 cup of flour and almond extract to the pan and turn down heat to low. Use a fork to vigor-ously stir in flour until a ball of dough forms and beings to pull away from the side of the pan. Approximately 1 minute.

Remove pan from heat. Add 1 egg to the pan and with your fork beat it very very fast into the dough. Be sure that you do this quickly so that the egg does not scramble. Repeat with all eggs, continuing to beat vigorously, until you have a smooth velvety dough. Set aside to cool for about 10-15 minutes.

Make Frosting

While choux cools, in a medium sized bowl add softened butter and almond extract. Use a hand mixer to cream butter. Slowly add 3/4 cup of powdered sugar and beat together until the butter and sugar is a soft and creamy frosting. Set aside.

Assembling

Once choux has cooled, scoop it out onto the short crust. Do this one even sized scoop at a time, alternating between each crust to assure an even split.

Use a spoon, spatula, or your hands to smooth the layer of choux on each short crust into a flat layer that covers the top of the crust.

Add to oven and bake for 1 hr.

After 1 hr. the pastry should be golden brown and dry.

Remove pastries from oven and gently transfer to a cooling rack and store in a draft free space of your kitchen for at least 30 minutes. If there is a draft, your pastry will sink.

Final Assembly

Once pastry is cool, split frosting in two and frost the top of each in an even layer.

Top with sliced almonds and halved maraschino cherries, if desired.

Slice into strips and serve!

Notes

Storage:

Fridge: Cover and store in a fridge for up to 1 week.

Freezer: You can store the cooked Danish puff, unfrosted, in the freezer for up to 1 month. Let thaw completely and then frost before serving.

Substitutions:

Butter: Use unsalted butter and add 1/4 teaspoon of fine ground salt to your short crust flour and another 1/4 teaspoon to your choux flour. Give each a quick mix before continuing with the recipe.

Extract: You can use vanilla extract in place of the almond flavor in the choux and/or the frosting.
