Grace & Peace to you in the name of the One whom we await,

We have now started the official countdown to the celebration of the day that changed the world. The day God broke into the world in the form of an innocent, helpless, human baby. 

Stewardship Notes:

The October 2024 financial statements can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Total income received through October was \$559,676 (77% of budget.) Pledge income was \$436,190 and unpledged income was \$52,950. Interest income has already exceeded the full year's budget. Total income is slightly behind budget through the first ten months of the year. Income is expected to catch up some in November as pledge status letters were mailed in late October.
- 2. Overall expenses were slightly below budget at \$577,764 (80% of budget). Property income has increased to \$53,376, which offsets gross property expenditures of \$234,120. Net property expenses, Christian education, congregational fellowship and worship expenses are below budget through October.
- 3. There was a Net Loss through October \$18,088, reflecting the below budget income for 10 months. November and December are typically catch up months for members' pledges and for year end giving.

Service of Healing and Wholeness December 4 at 12:30pm in the Pines Sanctuary Followed by a Complimentary Fellowship Lunch at Café Express

Due to medical challenges and other personal issues, the lectionary readings from Job that we have heard this Fall took on added meaning for me. For example, I closely identified with these paraphrased words from the Prayer of Confession in our October 20 worship service – *I wonder how it could happen to me and why God allowed it to happen at all.*

For much of the year, I grieved the loss of pain-free mobility and wondered why it had happened to me as I had devoted so much effort to physical fitness. At some point, most of us grieve a wide range of losses in addition to the loss of health - e.g. loss of a loved one; a relationship; a job; a financial setback; or a loss of faith. Such experiences can be especially painful during Advent when we want to celebrate the grace-filled gift of Jesus and to share joy with friends and family.

In an attempt to help us experience the full range of emotions that can be part of Advent, there will be a Service of Healing and Wholeness (aka "Blue Christmas" service) on December 4 at 12:30pm in the Pines sanctuary. The service is designed to help us identify the emotions in our hearts as we begin Advent and to encourage us to experience all of them. There will also be time to share what is in your heart for those who feel led to do so. Everyone is encouraged to invite friends and family members. All attendees are also invited to join in a time of fellowship at a complimentary lunch at Café Express in City Center following the worship service.

Regardless of whether you attend the service, I pray that you will remember the closing words of the Prayer of Confession from our October 20 service:

Teach us that suffering is not sent to punish but, that through suffering, We may better understand and help heal the pain of others.

Finally, if you feel a need to seek ongoing help in dealing with a loss or difficult challenge in your life, feel free to contact Ann Guerra, Phil Wetz, or the church office to confidentially discuss the possibility of working with a Stephen Minister. Hoping to see many of you on December 4!
