

# The Music Department

### **Greetings from the Music Department!**

We have been singing a wonderful new hymn, "Healer of Our Every Ill," as the response to the Prayer of Confession. I am sure it will become even more meaningful to you when you hear of how it was written.

Marty Haugen wrote this meditative song during the winter of 1985-86. During this period, his family was staying at a retreat center in the Cascade Mountains of Washington State. On January 28, 1986, the space shuttle Challenger crashed shortly after take off.

### According to Haugen:

"In addition to the loss of seven astronauts, this crash was a symbolic loss for Americans. At Holden Village we had very infrequent communication with the outside world, so we did not know of the disaster for a couple of days. When we got some information, we held a service in the evening together, and "Healer of Our Every Ill" was written as an expression for our community to grieve together."

Haugen uses the text of this hymn as a prayer for healing, not only of the body, but also of the mind and spirit. The refrain, "Give us peace beyond our fear, and hope beyond our sorrow," is a powerful prayer and helps us express thoughts we find difficult to put into words.

Healer of our every ill, light of each tomorrow, give us peace beyond our fear, and hope beyond our sorrow. You who know our fears and sadness, grace us with your peace and gladness; Spirit of all comfort, fill our hearts. Healer of our every ill, light of each tomorrow, give us peace beyond our fear, and hope beyond our sorrow.

### **LABOR DAY OBSERVATIONS**

This federal holiday was established to celebrate the efforts and contributions of our nation's workers. When we think of the day, most of us relate to jobs which are done for monetary compensation. However, I would like to focus on the "work" of some of the members of the Pines family which I observed on Labor Day as they "worked" with the Holy Spirit to minister to God's children.

To begin, I agreed to meet a Pines family member at church that day in order to deliver a card and cross she wanted me to share with a patient at Methodist Hospital who I was visiting. This thoughtful gesture was so impactful that the patient held the cross for the entire hour during which we shared fellowship.

While I was awaiting the "delivery" at Pines, I observed another devoted Pines member quietly doing some needed maintenance so that his church family would have a fully functional facility in which to gather. I know that this individual has completed similar maintenance projects hundreds of times over the years at our church and I was so thankful for the dedicated use of his talents.

After I completed my visit at Methodist, I went to visit Sam Singer who at that time was still in the hospital after suffering a stroke. During my visit with Sam, he let me know that another devoted member of Pines had already visited him that morning (in addition to the visit Andy and Cheryl made the prior day) and that both visits had lifted his spirits.

As I was nearing the end of my visit with Sam, I realized that he had done far more to lift my spirits than I had done to support him. I had observed him affirm the efforts of the ICU doctor who had treated him throughout his stay and enabled him to make a quick recovery. I had also watched him explain to the speech pathologist the therapy work he had begun on his own to improve the clarity of his speech because he was determined to again help lead the Pines family in worship as the lay liturgist, a task he does so well. Even though he was in the hospital, Sam had been ministering full time to those around him.

In the time since Labor Day, I have given thanks multiple times for the gift of being surrounded by the many angels in the Pines family who "work" and minister on federal holidays and every other day of the year. Thanks be to God.


