

Stewardship



STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

- 1. Pledge income in July is exactly on target for the 7 months. Non-pledge income is still trailing well below forecast.
- 2. Overall, committee expenses remain below budget expectations. Mission expenditures are accrued on a 1/12th basis each month; Property and most other committee expenses were below or close to forecast.
- 3. Total Income was \$365,529; total expenses were \$354,550; leaving a Net Income of \$10,979 for the year as of 7/31/22. Maintaining a positive net income in the middle of summer when attendance sometimes falls off is a great financial position for this time of the year.

Session

Here are some highlights from the August Session meeting:

- · Session approved Cheryl Gans to preach on October 23 while Rev. Gans is out of town
- · approved a joint Sunday service between Pines and Mosaic Church to be held on World Communion Sunday, October 2, in the Family Life Center
- · approved "Kids in Worship" for the children's Sunday School curriculum
- · approved "the Old Testament" and "The Parables of Jesus" for the adult Sunday School curriculum
- · approved "Sacred Echo" for an all-church study during the Lenten season
- · defeated a motion to conduct all Sunday School classes only on the 1st and 3rd Sundays due to a shortage of teachers; the Christian Education Committee will convene to review other solutions, including recruiting more teacher volunteers to preserve weekly Sunday School
- · heard a report from the Missions Committee that generous Pines' members have exceeded the original August Agape offering goal, raising enough funds to provide 84 students with backpacks, with over a week left in the month (the new goal is 100 student backpacks)
- the Missions and Congregational Fellowship Committees are planning a thankfulness luncheon for Pines' mission partners on November 13; Congregational Fellowship is planning up to 7 meal events in the coming year



Thoughts From a Member...

Dear Friends - since many people are away during part of the summer months, I suspect you sometimes wonder if the ongoing ministries at Pines which you make possible are forgotten. So, I will share the details of a recent "Gratitude Hike" in which I give thanks for the many blessings in my life, including Pines Presbyterian and the many people who make its ministries possible.

The first photo shows me at the beginning of the hike which is Adam's Falls where all of the waters in subsequent photos flow into Grand Lake before they are transported to eastern Colorado to sustain life for most of the state's population. The ever present waters remind me of God's faithfulness in walking with us.

The second photo from the top shows us hiking in what I call the "Psalm 23" meadow with its still and quiet waters and lush green grasses. It is especially beautiful in the early morning sunlight when it is easy to sense God's comforting presence.

As we begin our 2000' elevation gain to reach our destination, Lake Verna, the heightened elevation affords us a view of where we started which is Grand Lake. Looking back at life's journey can often be a catalyst for thanksgiving.

The fourth photo shows the stream which runs from Lake Verna to our beginning point of Grand Lake and serves as a reminder of God's continuing presence regardless of where we travel.

The fifth photo shows the first lake we reach after hiking 5.5 miles. It is Lone Pine Lake. While not our ultimate destination, it reminds us to enjoy the beauty we sometimes overlook in our journeys.

Finally after another 1.5 miles of uphill hiking we reach our destination of Lake Verna which is shown in the bottom photo. Each year when I get there I give thanks for another year of life, the blessings which unfolded during the year and the ability to once again complete this 14 mile round trip hike. Of course the Pines church family and its many ministries were prominent among the blessings for which I gave thanks. What an indescribable gift!

While it is wonderful to be refreshed by the beauty of God's creation, I remain aware of the suffering and turmoil in our world and I also pray for God's healing hand to be at work.

Thanks again for hiking with me and allowing me to share my reflections as God stirs my heart. Phil
