

Pastor's Page

Grace & Peace in the name of Christ,

Often times we look to the scriptures to see the miracles with which God has blessed his people. We love to read about the miracle of the parting of the Red Sea, the saving of Daniel from the jaws of the fierce lion, the ability of Meshack, Shadrack and Abednego to avoid being consumed by the fiery furnace. The New Testament is no different when we read about Jesus healing the blind man, the cripple and the leper, or how about feeding the thousands with a miniscule amount of bread and fish. These are amazing stories of miracles that happened so long ago, but what about miracles since the canonization of the Bible. Do we still hear about God's miraculous work since the time of scriptures?

Enter Oberammergau, a small village located in the southern Bavarian province of Germany. In 1633, the residents of Oberammergau, vowed that if God spared them from the bubonic plague ravaging the region, they would produce a play thereafter for all time every 10 years depicting the life and death of Jesus. The death rate among adults rose from one person per 1000 per year in October 1632 to twenty in the month of March 1633. The adult death rate slowly subsided to one in the month of July 1633. The villagers believed a miracle had occurred and that they had been spared. They kept their part of the vow when the play was first performed in 1634. The play is now known as the *Passion Play* and tradition will hold as the next play is planned for the summer of 2020. The play is a staging of Jesus' passion, covering the short final period of his life from his visit to Jerusalem and leading to his execution by crucifixion.

I would like to invite you and friends to join us as we travel to experience this world-renowned time-honored commitment to God's faithful and miraculous works on June 3rd of 2020. Our 11-day tour will take us to some of Europe's most interesting countries including the Czech Republic, Hungary, Austria and Germany. The scenery is absolutely spectacular as we travel through the plains and valleys of the magnificent eastern European countryside. The points of interest are very diverse, spotlighting historical places and natural wonders. In addition to our time spent in Oberammergau, we will have the opportunity to enjoy visits to the beautiful city of Prague, the enchanting city of Budapest, the elegant and historic musical city of Vienna, and the Bavarian capital of Munich. I hope you will consider joining us on this amazing journey to witness one of the most historic depictions of Christ's passion, and one community's remarkable dedication to their faith.

Our journey will begin on June 3rd, **2020**, but we will have an informational meeting on Sunday, November 18 following worship in room C-3. I hope you will consider joining us. In Christ,

Passion Play in Oberammergau

Are you ready to travel? It is with great pleasure and excitement that we invite you to join us on our 11 Days Splendors of Eastern Europe tour with a once in a lifetime opportunity to attend the world famous Passion Play in 2020 in Oberammergau, Germany departing June 3, 2020. The points of interest are very diverse spotlighting historical places and natural wonders.

In addition to our time spent in Oberammergau, we will have the opportunity to enjoy visits to Prague, the beautiful 1,000-year-old capital of the Czech Republic; Budapest, Hungary's enchanting capital on the Danube River; Vienna, Austria's elegant city with an old world ambience and a rich musical heritage; and Munich, the capital of Bavaria.

The price of our tour includes roundtrip airfare, first class/select hotels, private homes/pensions in Oberammergau, most meals, first class admission tickets for the Passion Play, the services of a professional tour director, taxes, most tips, and sightseeing in a deluxe motor coach. Our cost is \$4,499 per person based on double occupancy and you'll have until 2020 to make the final payment.

Christ caring for people through people Do you know what Stephen Ministry is all about?

Stephen Ministry began at Pines more than 20 years ago and is a one-on-one caring ministry. Our Stephen Ministers receive fifty hours of training and even more, they are undergirded by prayer and love as they MINISTRY serve those who are in need of someone to talk with confidentially.

There is a phrase in the Old Testament, לֵב שׁמֵעֵל which is often translated "understanding heart" but it literally means "hearing heart". This is what Stephen Ministers offer to any relationship. They are ones who tune their hearts to listen to both those they are with and to God as they offer love and care. Agape Communion Offering November

<u>The AGAPE Communion Offering</u> - The Greek word Agape is used in the New Testament to refer to a kind of love that is not necessarily a feeling but a motivation for action, a sacrificial love that voluntarily gives without expecting anything in return. We are called to Agape love through Christ's example, and we remember that example of sacrifice when we celebrate the Lord's Supper. In order to bring greater awareness of and participation in the Service and Outreach "outside our walls" ministry projects throughout the year, the **Agape Communion Offering** of small, tangible goods will coincide each month with the celebration of Holy Communion. Families are encouraged to participate together in selecting an item to donate and bring to the baskets in the narthex on the <u>first Sunday</u> of each month.
