## A Message From Our Pastor

Happy New Year in Christ's name,

As I sat with my family watching the seconds of 2017 tick away on New Year's Eve, I couldn't help but think about how much my world changed over the past 365 days. A year ago I was anxiously awaiting my visit to Pines as the PNC and I discerned God's will and calling. A few months later I left my congregation and friends of nine years to journey to my new family of faith here in Houston. I was blessed to have my youngest daughter graduate from high school and enter her college years, luckily not too far up the road. I experienced a hurricane that devastated many, hurt my heart, but gave me hope in God's children as I saw faithful people respond with an agape (self-sacrificing) love that continues to this day. And after nearly eight months, I was finally able to officially call Houston my home with the move of my wife and dog to this great city.

Amazing things have also happened in the life and ministry of Pines. You said good-bye to pastor Lucia and welcomed me. You participated in amazing mission projects, cared for and loved on hurting family members, supported and reached out to Hurricane Harvey victims, and you completed the New Beginnings program. Your passion for God's people and this church is amazing.

As we look into 2018 I want to share with you some of the things your Session, and the Vision and Planning Committee (V&P), have been working on since the completion of the New Beginnings program. The first order of business was the creation of a new vision and mission statement which was completed mid-summer. Thanks to Harvey the annual Session retreat was postponed and finally held in November. The retreat was filled with great energy as we took the results of the New Beginnings gatherings and began dreaming of what we thought Pines could be in the coming months and years, and most importantly how to achieve those dreams. Discussing the results of the New Beginnings process and the many ideas of session members, four priority action areas for 2018 were selected. The areas receiving extensive focus will be the youth ministry program, worship, end-to-end communication/marketing strategy, and every-member outreach. These four areas have each been assigned a special task force charged with investigating the issue, developing a plan, reporting to Session, and then executing the plan.

The Youth Ministry Team will be looking at staffing options for the program as well as developing an interim plan until a staff person can be in place. The worship task force will be evaluating current worship opportunities, while also investigating other options that might appeal to the surrounding population that might not be attending worship. The communications task force will investigate and implement a plan that will help Pines communicate within our family and outside our family using all available 21<sup>st</sup> century communications platforms. This group will also look into the possible need for an additional staff person to carry out the communication and marketing strategy. Last, but certainly not least will be the Caring Committee developing a ministry plan to reach out and be in contact with every member of our church on an ongoing basis. Our church family is one of the most important resources we have. We need to take care of, walk with, lift up, love on and listen to each of you if we are to be the body of Christ and serve the Kingdom of God.

I am excited about what God is doing, and will do at Pines in 2018! I pray you can join in the excitement as we seek to serve our mighty God.

## **Greetings From the Music Department**



Let everything that has breath praise the LORD. Psalm 150.

We welcome everyone who would like to musically praise the Lord to consider these opportunities in the Pines Music Department!

**The Chancel Choir.** The Chancel Choir adds to the 11:00 a.m. morning Worship Services with leading the hymns, providing an Anthem and an Introit. The Chancel Choir rehearses every Wednesday at 7:00 p.m. in the Choir Room, and again at 10:30 a.m. on Sundays to prepare for the Worship Service. We present a Christmas Cantata every year, and a Good Friday presentation. In June, we have fun in presenting FOLLIES!, a salute to Broadway, with dinner and a show. There are extra called rehearsals for the special presentations, usually on Saturdays at 9:00 a.m.

**The Pines Pealers.** This group is the Pines Bell Choir directed by Bethel Strawser. The Pealers are on a winter break at the moment. When the Pealers reconvene, they will rehearse at 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday evenings in the Bell Room. They bless the services on the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of the month with an Anthem, a Chiming of the Hour, and enhancing the congregational singing by playing the hymns. The Pealers also play for special services during the year.

**The Pines Orchestra.** The Orchestra plays on the second Sunday of the month, providing music for the Prelude, Postlude, and accompanying the hymns during the 11:00 a.m. service. Rehearsal times for this group are the second Tuesday of the month at 7:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary, and 8:30 a.m. on the second Sunday before the 9:30 a.m. Worship Service. This group also accompanies the Chancel Choir for the Christmas and Easter music.

**Joyful Noise Children's Choir.** The Children rehearse every Sunday at 10:30 a.m. This wonderful group, directed by Shirley Bollich, blesses the congregation with an Anthem at special times of the year.

**The Men's Chorale.** The men in this group sing in both services once a month. The music here is mostly gospel. The men also sing at various times during the year for the Buckingham and Parkway Place. We rehearse on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month at 6:00 p.m. in the Choir Room.



# **Stephen Ministry**

#### **CANCER, NOW WHAT?**

All of us have had family members and/or close friends impacted by the diagnosis of a serious medical condition. At those times, we want to provide comfort and support but often do not know the best way to do so. During the Stephen Leader training session I attended, the staff previewed a new book entitled, "Cancer, Now What?" written by Dr. Kenneth Haugk who founded the Stephen Minister program and supported his wife during her battle with ovarian cancer. Suggestions which I found helpful and wanted to share include:

Your goal is not to make the person who has received the diagnosis feel better or to cheer them up, but to listen in order to provide the chance for them to share what is in their heart

Do not make "promises" you cannot keep or be sure of (e.g. chemo treatments will help you; new discoveries are being made all of the time).

Instead of saying "call me if you need anything", learn what your gifts are and how you can use them to make specific offers to help (e.g. what errands can I do for you? what appointments can I drive you to? when can I care for your pets?). Needs will change so feel free to repeat such offers.

Check in on the caregiver and also give that person the chance to talk.

Sincere written expressions of support are impactful and appreciated even though they probably will not be acknowledged.

Ask if there are specific prayer requests which the person has.

While Stephen Ministers are often called upon to provide support in such situations, we recognize that invaluable support is often provided by family and close friends. We hope these suggestions are helpful to those who encounter such situations. If you are interested in reading more, there is a copy of "Cancer, Now What?" in the Stephen Minister library in Room C-8.
