
Worship and Imposition of Ashes Service

Pastor's Page

Grace and peace to you,

Six years ago this month Cheryl and I made our very first visit to Pines. We were excited to meet the PNC face to face and see what Pines was all about. I remember sitting on the plane returning to Florida and talking with Cheryl about our take aways from the weekend. We both agreed that our greatest take away was the feeling we had surrounding prayer. We both felt that Pines placed a great emphasis on prayer in everything it did. We appreciated that so much, because prayer is very, very important to both of us. It was this overwhelming sense of importance of prayer that swayed us to join this incredible family of faith.

During seminary one of my favorite passages was from Philippians 4. I came to lean on and tried to trust in its words that reminded me, "Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." These words reminded me of the importance of prayer in my life throughout all situations. It is prayer that should be the foundation and cornerstone of all we dream and desire in our lives. I believe, without a good foundation and cornerstone of prayer, what we desire and undertake will crumble.

This past January's Feed My Starving Children (FMSC) MobilePackTM was a perfect example of the importance of prayer. This was our third MobilePackTM event, and each year I work with a team of people who begin to lay the solid foundation for a successful MobilePackTM with prayer. There is no way this massive service project would get off the ground and be successful unless we rooted it in prayer. Over the three years of hosting this project I have often been asked, and even asked myself, "How are you going to get 500 volunteers? How are you going to raise \$25,000?" Each time I'm asked this question I usually respond by saying, "I'm praying I'm not going to do it, but God is." This incredible mission wouldn't be possible unless it was surrounded in prayer from the time we pray about a date for the pack to when the tractor trailer full of meals pulls out of our parking lot. This year your prayers sent us nearly 500 volunteers from our surrounding community. Your prayers helped us reach our goal of \$25,000. Your prayers covered us while we exceeded our packing goal and assembled 108,864 meals, which will provide one nutritious meal a day for a year to 298 starving children. Your prayers will save 298 children from death caused by starvation.

Prayer is a powerful thing in this world. Prayer is about making your supplications known to God AND it's about listening for God's direction to answer those prayers. Sometimes though, that answer is heard or expressed through what some call God's echo. That's why I'm excited we will be doing a church wide study on prayer and listening for God's echo. Our Christian Education Committee has selected the book Sacred Echo by Margaret Fienberg for us to read as a church family. The book asks, "Are you ready to shake up your prayer life forever? Often when God speaks, God will echo the same message through a sermon, a passage of Scripture, a chance conversation, or an unexpected encounter. When we begin looking for these sacred echoes, we are better able to recognize God's voice in our life and walk more confidently in the fullness of all God has for us."

So are you ready to pray and listen for the echo? Are you ready for where God will take us when we pray?


Sacred Echo Lenten Small Group Study for Adults:

STEWARDSHIP NOTES

- 1. Both pledge and non-pledge income ended 2022 year within 1% of the budgeted amounts! God is good. December pledge and non-pledge contributions exceeded expectations making it possible to achieve this result. Thanks to all who made contributions to fulfill or exceed their pledge.
- Overall, most committee expenses are below budget expectations for the year.
 Worship committee is slightly above budget and Property expenses are well above budget due to repairs and higher costs for our building.
- 3. Total Income was \$681,031; total expenses were \$668,592; leaving a Net Income of \$13,439 for the year, \$15,294 below the budgeted Net Income of \$28,733.
- 4. In the spirit of financial transparency, the Session has scheduled an information session with lunch following worship on February 12. We will review income projections and committee budget requests and answer any questions that arise.

Session

The Session met for its regular stated meeting on January 23. Here are some highlights (including highlights from a special called meeting in December):

- Session welcomed and accepted Pam and Fred Ellis as new members of Pines.
- The Stewardship Committee presented a proposed budget for 2023. Following discussion, Session approved a Congregational Lunch Gathering to be held after Worship on February 12 to present to the congregation the results of the 2022 budget and the 2023 preliminary budget. The meeting will be held in the Fellowship Hall with lunch provided.
- Session approved on first reading a full revision to the Policies and Procedures Manual, the first complete revision since 2006.
- Session approved the 2022 Statistical Report to Presbytery, reflecting among other things 336 active members of Pines as of 12-31-2022.
- Session approved a meditative service to be held on Ash Wednesday, February 22, around the noon hour, to be organized by the Worship Committee.
- The memorial service for Jerry Mowell was approved in the Sanctuary for February 4 at 2 p.m. A private service in the Columbarium will be held on February 5.
- The Session and Staff Retreat was approved for March 3 and 4, with the examination of the elders-elect for the Class of 2026 to be conducted on March 4.
- John Plush has been re-elected Treasurer for a one-year term beginning January 1, 2023.
- Craig Walker has been re-elected Clerk for a one-year term beginning March 1, 2023.

During the December 15 Service for Healing and Wholeness, I read the familiar words below from the third chapter of Ecclesiastes:

There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens: a time to be born and a time to die, a time to plant and a time to uproot, a time to weep and a time to laugh, a time to mourn and a time to dance.

As I read those words, I could never have envisioned the dramatic changes which would occur in the month of January for the Stephen Ministry program at Pines. Due to a need to focus on some health issues, Bill Willis recently informed the Stephen Leaders that he will need to take a "sabbatical" from leading this program. The Stephen Leaders fully support Bill's decision to concentrate on his health and are indebted to him for his leadership since taking over that role from Barbara when she retired. We are particularly grateful for Bill's leadership in planning, organizing and helping to implement the six month training program for the four new Stephen Ministers who were trained in 2022.

While Bill is away, Ann Guerra and I will lead the Stephen Ministry program and will serve as contacts for those who want to explore establishing a relationship with a Stephen Minister. The other major change for the Stephen Ministry program was the recent death of our beloved friend, Jerry Mowell. Jerry was instrumental in bringing the Stephen Ministry concept to Pines in 1994 and remained active as a Stephen Minister and Stephen Leader until her death on January 12. In fact, she was one of those who helped train the new class of Stephen Ministers in 2022. The Stephen Minister website states that all Stephen Ministers "share a passion for bringing Christ's love and care to people during a time of need." No one has ever done this work with more faithfulness or love than Jerry did. Her ministry served as a role model for all of her fellow Stephen Ministers. All of the Stephen Ministers ask for your prayers in helping us to carry on this ministry in ways that would honor Jerry's efforts and be pleasing in the sight of our Lord. Thanks for your support.
