

STEWARDSHIP UPDATE:

The March 2024 financial statements can be summarized as follows... Pines continues to be a blessed church!



- 1. Total income received through March was \$200,912 (28% of annual budget.) Pledge income was \$165,943 and unpledged income was \$14,484. Interest income also exceeds the budgeted amount for 3 months. Total income is slightly ahead of budget through first quarter.
- 2. Overall expenses were right on target at \$179,963 (25% of annual budget.) Cindy has filed an insurance claim for the plumbing repair we had in December, which, if received, will reduce property expenses. The Preschool is expected to pay their annual contribution (\$26,278) in April, which will help net property expenses.
- 3. Net income through March was \$20,949... a great first quarter.

- Approved an addition to the Policy and Procedures Manual setting clear guidelines for fundraising by outside organizations.
- Approved a memorial service for Fred Kelly on May 10 at 10:0am in the Sanctuary.
- Gave thanks for a successful Prayer Pal dinner on April 21 and for the dedication of Prayer Pals to the children and youth of Pines.

STEPHEN MINISTRY AND BASEBALL – A WONDERFUL COMBINATION

In March, I was very fortunate to spend a week in Florida with a long-time friend who had invited me to join him in watching spring training baseball games. It was a wonderful week of fellowship with my friend as well as with several other fans in the stands who shared our passionate love for this special game.

Several people have asked me if there was a special highlight that will always be remembered. There were many excellent plays in the games and a special moment when another friend who met us caught a foul ball and gave it to a young boy sitting behind us.

However, the most memorable moment was when a young girl (around age 10) threw out the first pitch from the pitcher's mound to her father who happened to be a coach for one of the teams we were watching. While her throw to her dad was excellent, the most memorable event occurred after her dad caught her toss. At that moment, she started running full speed to her father who was patiently waiting for her. As she got near to her father, she jumped into his arms, and they shared an extended embrace.

While attending baseball games, I have witnessed many great events – a no-hitter; a grand slam home run; game-winning home runs; a suicide squeeze play; a triple play; and getting to hear Frank Sinatra sing "New York, New York" after a Yankees victory in Yankee Stadium. However, watching this young girl and her father share their love for each other is the most enjoyable event I have witnessed in a baseball stadium.

After some thought, I concluded that the event involving the young girl and her father is similar in some ways to what occurs between a Stephen Minister and a care receiver. For example:

- It took courage for the young girl to step out and try something new just as it takes courage for someone to discuss the possibility of working with a Stephen Minister.
- As the young girl began running to her father, she knew he would be there waiting for her just as a care receiver knows that a Stephen Minister will be faithful in consistently meeting with the care receiver.
- Regardless of the "quality" of the girl's throw, she knew her dad would affirm her efforts and continue to work with her to improve just as a Stephen Minister will unconditionally accept where the care receiver is on their journey and strive to help them grow.
- The girl knew her father would patiently and lovingly listen to her story of how it felt to do this new task and would affirm her efforts which is what Stephen Ministers pledge to do.



Interested in serving on a mission team with Faith in Practice?


