Summer Greetings,

This past month we welcomed over 110 children to our campus for our annual Vacation Bible School. The time with these children and volunteers was amazing, and I'm so thankful for them! As I watched them come in and out of our doors, I was amazed how big some of them had gotten over the past year. I also wondered how much of a growth spurt they'd have before school begins in the fall. Seeing these growth spurts in the children reminded me of the parable of the mustard seed in the Gospel of Mark. I thought about the seed being planted and it growing so large, even when we don't notice its growth at some points. I also thought about how that seed, and plant, need to be nourished so that its branches can grow into one of the largest shrubs.

Often time's adults put a lot of emphasis on the physical and spiritual nourishment and nurture of children and youth. We make sure they eat their vegetables and get plenty of fruits so they can grow healthy and strong bodies. We also want to make sure their faith is nourished as well by making sure we bring them to Sunday school, send them to Vacation Bible School, Children's Church, Conclaves or on a mission trip. As parents we want to make sure they have a good foundation. But sometimes, as they grow, we don't seem to emphasize that same nourishment.

Why do we think healthy habits are only necessary for younger people? We all need to maintain a healthy lifestyle of nutrition and exercise for our bodies AND our faith no matter our age. We all still have the ability to grow. Summer is often a time of growth, so how are you going to grow this summer? What are you going to do to grow in your faith? What do you have planned to strengthen your relationship with God and walk in the ways of Jesus of Nazareth? As your body needs nourishment and care to grow, so does your relationship with God. Take time this summer to give your faith, and your relationship with God, some extra good nourishment so it can grow strong and give you encouragement and purpose for tomorrow.



Property Committee Update

All.... The property committee operates the Pines physical facility on a budget of \sim \$200,000 annually. This amount has stayed flat over the past 3 years. As a regular newsletter feature, the committee will bring you up to date with a few of the major expenditures to provide greater transparency and understanding of the stewardship of your donations.

Two of the primary projects ongoing are a leak repair and replacement of the Plexiglas on the stained glass window and back parking lot asphalt repairs.

The stained glass window has experienced some leakage into the wall, and we will assess that issue upon opening the wall to replace the leak. The initial cost to replace the Plexiglas and make outside repairs is \$9,000. Two bids within \$200 were received, and work should commence by July 15.

Asphalt repair is estimated to cost \$2,500. Not only is the main pothole towards West Bough in the middle roadway going to be repaired, but some emerging issues will be address as well.

Thank you for your support as we address these two issues.


through graphic design and developed a deeper love of experiencing nature.

On another occasion we were not the givers at all, but we were able to host the environment that cultivated generosity. A



group of adults approached our truck, clearly hungry, digging through their collective pockets for enough money to share a plate of food. Another woman, a regular customer of ours who herself has known both struggle and God's care, came to the back window to secretly give Alastair \$40 so they could order whatever their hearts desired. They received the news of this anonymous gift with tears in their eyes, and they dined on pancakes and love.

It continues to be a steep learning curve as we give ourselves to follow Jesus in this realm of "business for benefit," but He encourages us daily, giving us (in the language of Isaiah 55) both bread to share and seed to sow. Reflections on 30 years ~ It Goes Both Ways!

I walked into my office (now C-8) on June 5, 1989 with the intention of being at Pines Presbyterian Church for one year. I had been hired as a one year interim while the church was in search of an associate pastor. Thirty years later I am still here. In that time, I have served with five senior pastors, three associates, five youth directors, and three children's directors. We have gone through two major building renovations, we have moved from typewriters to computers, from cassette tapes to live streaming, from the "red" to the "blue" hymnals to the use of the screens. My ministry began as director of Christian education and evolved to children's ministry, adult ministry, and eventually, ordained ministry.

In 1989, Pines welcome me and my small family which included a ten-month-old son, and within five years, embraced our daughter and another son. Pines was there for my family when my children were baptized and when they started school. They have held my babies in the nursery, taught them at VBS, led them in the preschool Cherub Choir, directed them in Christmas pageants. They were there to cheer them on in sports and musical endeavors and to teach them about Jesus and mentor them during confirmation. My Pines family walked with my kids when they went on their first mission trips and participated in Celebration and confessed their faith in Jesus Christ. And Pines walked with us and loved us and prayed for us when I went through a divorce. And Pines celebrated with us when God brought Steve into my life, and you embraced him as your own right from the start, even laughing at his antics and corny jokes!

Together we have said good-bye to some wonderful friends and together we have celebrated with others during special moments in their lives. We have tried new ministries and let others die, we have started new classes, learned new hymns, welcomed new friends, and reached out to the community in numerous ways. We have faced challenges, mucked out houses, fallen down and gotten back up on our feet. We have prayed and worshipped together, and prayed and worshipped together.

More than ever I am convinced that we can never take for granted what it means to be part of a Christian community. As I look back, I wonder where I would be if Walter Crofton and Pines hadn't taken a chance on a 27-year-old to lead their Christian Education program. What kind of parent would I have been to my little ones if I had not learned from the amazing teachers in the Pines preschool? What adults would have been part of their lives if they didn't have the youth leaders here to love and mentor them? Where would we have been without the love, support, prayers of this family of faith when I found myself single? If Pines had not encouraged me to explore new avenues of ministry, blessed my call to train as a spiritual director, supported me through seminary, where would I be?

All to say... it goes both ways! Pines, you have been an incredible blessing in my life and the life of my children!! I cannot even recount all the ways! And undergirding it all, providing a foundation stronger than all of us combined, nudging us toward beauty and service and grace, working in unseen ways to transform and shape us...is the mysterious and glorious love of Christ! So all to say...all thanks goes to God! And to God be the glory!

Christ caring for people through people STEPHEN MINISTRY In Stephen Ministry we refer to ourselves as Caregivers. When discussing our relationships with those we serve, we refer to them as our Care-receivers so as not to divulge their identity. Unless we choose never to love or to be in relationship with anyone (perhaps such people exist, but I don't know any personally) we are all both Caregivers and Care-receivers at various points in our lives. Oftentimes we are both. We don't always think about it this way, but when we are thrust into the role of being a Primary Caregiver, particularly when ministering to the needs of a loved one who is facing a sudden or long term illness, we need to receive a little more care than usual ourselves. One of the most important rules of primary care giving is to *take care of yourself*, physically, emotionally, and spiritually. And it is one of the hardest things to do. It is healthy to not be afraid to seek and accept the care of others when we are faced with such a challenge. I know this to be true from personal experience.

In fact, many of our Care Receivers in Stephen Ministry are individuals who are faced with the challenges of being a Primary Caregiver. Also, most of our Stephen Ministers have been in their shoes at some point in their lives. A Stephen Minister can help with the emotional and spiritual aspects of self care. They will devote an hour or so per week, supporting their Care Receiver by listening to and praying for and with them. For me, it was a blessing to be reminded by my Stephen Minister family, that the emotions and challenges I was experiencing as a Primary Caregiver were normal and that Christ is always with me, even in difficult times.

I have shared before in this column from Henry Nouwen's <u>Life of the Beloved</u>. In the chapter entitled "Given", he writes:

"In the giving it becomes clear that we are chosen, blessed, and broken not simply for our own sakes, but so that all we live finds its final significance in its being lived for others."

Perhaps you have need of the support a Stephen Minister can provide at this time. Or perhaps you are at a stage where you can give back and would be interested in becoming a Stephen Minister.
