
Can you add one more person to your prayers?

**STEWARDSHIP UPDATE** The August, 2023 financial statements can be summarized as follows:

- 1. Pledge income for 8 months continues very slightly under budget. Non-pledge income received through August is well ahead (79%) of the year's budget due to unexpected early gifts and continued strong giving.
- 2. Overall expenses were underbudget for eight months. Property income is ahead of budget offsetting well controlled property expenditures. Mission spending is well under budget. The final benevolence payments are typically made in November. Staff committee expenses are right on target.
- 3. Total Income was \$441,989; total expenses were \$398,988; leaving a Net Income of \$43,001 for August, continuing our very strong performance for the year.

The 2024 Stewardship campaign is ongoing. Commitment Sunday, when Giving Goals will be received during worship, is October 8, 2023. Thank you for considering your family's commitment to Pines.

# Session The Session met for its regular stated meeting on September 25. Here are some highlights:

- Session approved the 2024 Youth Mission Trip to Belize with Praying Pelicans from June 29 to July 5.
- Session approved the Christian Education Committee's tentative churchwide study or Sunday School class using *The Bible in 90 Days*, written by Ted Cooper. The Committee will examine the best time to begin the study.
- Session approved the Youth Ministry Sunday School curriculum "Defending Our Faith," looking at faith from the different perspectives of numerous theologians and scholars. Session also enthusiastically approved Cole Liles to teach the course.
- Session also approved a Congregational Meeting to be held after Worship on November 5 to elect elders for the Class of 2007.
- Mark your calendars: there will be a potluck luncheon after Worship on October 1 for World Communion Sunday, followed by a hymn sing featuring the full Music Department; the next Church Workday will be on Saturday, November 4!
- Elders on Session prayerfully presented their Giving Goal pledge cards in support of the 2024 Stewardship Campaign

The children's Sunday School class was learning how they were made in God's image. The children were asked to look in the mirror and tell us their best quality. We heard everything from their new shoes to their muscles to their heart, hair, and toes.

As I observed them looking at themselves, they were squirmy, uncomfortable, and shy. Have you ever looked at yourself in the mirror and listed your best quality(ies) that God gave you? If you did, were you squirmy or uncomfortable?

Is it hard to accept that you are precious children of God made in his image? Think about that. We are unique and special and most of the time don't allow ourselves to be grateful to God for what and who we are. I had a season in my life where I wouldn't allow myself to see the good qualities. Because of some choices I made, I was so full of self-doubt, fear, and shame that I wouldn't allow myself to receive the positive things God blessed me with. I refused to trust that he knew the plans he had for me as we learn in Jeremiah 29:11. I was fortunate that God put a person in my life that challenged me to put affirmations all over my house and say at least one to myself *in the mirror* each day. That's easy you say! No, it is not! It took months for me to comfortably say and believe those positive things about myself.

Have you made some choices you are not proud of? Are you struggling to believe you are a precious child of God? Do you struggle to look in the mirror to see how God has blessed you? Pray about affirming yourself and ask God to place someone in your life that can help you accept He loves you- always.




### **Questions or concerns about PROSTATE CANCER?**
