It is a blessing to live in a world where we know Easter has happened and continues to happen every day! Each day God gives us is an opportunity to experience the newness of a life alive with the Risen Christ. Easter frees us to live into the joy that is faith, freedom and hope.

I am excited that Easter means renewal and adventure. I believe Pines is in an Easter time. Within the next six months we will welcome three new staff members to our family of faith. As we welcome a Youth Director, Children's Director and Communications Coordinator, each one will bring with them new ideas and an enthusiastic attitude for adventure. As the search committees seek those whom God has called to Pines, they will be leaning on God's guidance to find the people who are passionate about their faith in Christ, energetic about engaging God's people, and willing to join in leading this congregation into its next chapter of faithfully, and actively, living out the Gospel. I ask that you keep the search committees, and the ones whom God will call, in your prayers.

The Session is also excited about this Easter time at Pines. During the its last retreat the Session came up with two priorities that will help us Look Upward, Grow Inward and Serve Outward. In early fall we will encourage everyone to take part in a church wide study of the book "The Case for Christ" by Lee Strobel. Strobel, a former legal journalist and one-time atheist knows how to ask tough questions. His own search for truth about Jesus led him to faith in Christ. The prayer of the Session is that this small group study will strengthen our bonds with each other, and by the end of the study, groups may very well see Jesus in a new way--and even, like Strobel, find their life and faith transformed. The Christian Education Committee will have more information about the study coming very soon.

The second priority came after much discussion and prayer. The prayer was how can Pines find a creative way of opening our doors, letting the community know we are here, while at the same time serve the Kingdom. The prayer and discussion revealed that Pines should host a community wide mission project. The mission project we chose was Feed My Starving Children. This project uses church and community volunteers to assemble and package nutritious meals for hungry children around the world. This amazing project will give all members of Pines the opportunity to live into our mission and share our love with our local and global community. The theme for the weekend was "Bent but Not Broken" which led the youth to discuss ways to walk hand in hand with our Lord while facing challenging times. In addition to those discussions, the youth participated in two service projects which served as a reminder that we are called to support others who are facing difficult times.

During our discussion time as a church family, the youth spoke about the most meaningful activity of the weekend. SHERWOOD MENTORING PROGRAM

We're looking into bringing back our Sherwood Mentoring Program for the 2018-2019 school year. As many of you know, over the years Pines has provided a large number of volunteers who work one on one with Sherwood students. Recently, our presence in the Sherwood Mentoring Program has dwindled. But I'm pleased to say, in recent months the Missions Committee has been approached repeatedly about bringing the mentoring program back to life. So this is the official call to action for anyone who would like to participate in this worthy and rewarding ministry beginning in August, 2018.

Pines will coordinate with the Sherwood counselor to match you with a child based on your interests and preferences. Normally the mentoring period is for 30 minutes per week, during the school day. The child is allowed out of the classroom to meet with you on campus. The child's teacher and school counselor work together with you to provide appropriate materials and instruction for your time with the child. This is all done under the supervision and protocol of Spring Branch ISD's volunteer program. As such, eventually you will need to register online and agree to a criminal history background check. But at this point, we're simply gauging interest, so no need to register, yet.

Don't worry about committing for every week of the school year. We understand things come up in your life and there will be times when the school calendar prohibits visits. MISSION HIGHLIGHTS

Your Missions Committee is happy to report that at our March meeting we awarded a \$10,000 Next Generation grant to Houston Hope of the Nations, a worshiping community ministering to immigrants, primarily from the Middle East. Houston Hope of the Nations (HHN) is led by Rev. Eid Abdelmassih Hanna in conjunction with and the support of our Presbytery. HHN is also supported by several other churches in the area and is governed by a board of volunteers primarily from those congregations.

HHN meets every Sunday afternoon at St. Thomas Presbyterian. Average worship attendance is 30-45 and the service is in English so feel free to worship with them! Eid spends much of his time helping HHN members with the basic necessities and assists them in acclimating to our culture. Many of these brothers and sisters arrive in Houston with no money, no job, and no transportation. What they do have is a hunger for a better way. HHN is working diligently to improve lives and increase the faith of their congregation. Pines is blessed to have the opportunity to walk along with HHN. WHAT'S A NEXT GENERATION GRANT????

Pines Next Generation Grants for New Worshiping Communities came out of our successful Next Generation Capital Campaign back in 2013. The Capital Campaign raised funds for an extensive renovation and addition to many areas of our church campus. The Session allocated a specific percentage of funds raised in the Capital Campaign be set aside to encourage new church development and to support Benevolence to worthy organization(s).

As a result of our congregation's generous giving to the Next Generation Campaign, the Missions Committee (formerly the Benevolence Committee) was instructed to distribute \$180,000, split equally between deserving charitable organizations and new church developments. Here's how the funds have been distributed, thus far:
