# Pastor's Page

#### Happy Advent in the name of the One who is to come,

I am sure you are probably tired of hearing, and knowing, how things are different this year. We're tired that we can't gather the way we like to, tired that we can't shop, eat out or eat in with others. I think we're also tired of being worried. We worry about masks, when a vaccine will be available; will I, or one of my friends or family members get sick. It seems that since COVID struck our emotions have been on edge and we're just not acting like ourselves.

We often ask the question, "what is it going to take to get back to 'normal'." Who knows what normal is or will be in 2021? I don't, but what I do know is that this season of Advent points us to the One who does know our future, the One who offers hope when things seem dim, has faith in us even when our faith wanes, offers us joy so deeply rooted that even the darkest days seem bright, the One who helps us find peace in our most violent storms, and loves us unconditionally. 

# Stewardship

Thank you to all who participated in Taco and a Pledge Sunday! We enjoyed terrific breakfast tacos and received 2021 pledges from just over 1/2 (55%) of the members who made pledges for 2020. This is good news... but we still need to hear from more members. If you were unable to attend last Sunday it's not too late to return your 2021 pledge information by returning the card you received in the mail, downloading a pledge card from the Pines website to return or simply sending an email with your pledge to our accounting manager, Alexis Graham, at <a href="mailto:alexis@pinespc.org">alexis@pinespc.org</a>. Pines needs your financial support to move Forward Together in Faith.



#### **Stewardship Notes:**

- 1. Pledge income is running behind through 10 months (72% received, vs 83% expected.) It is normal to expect some catch up in the last two months of the year. Overall income is also running behind (68% received, vs 83% expected.) The additional underage is due to non-pledge income running well below prior years experience due to Covid shut down.
- 2. Expenses are also running below budget year to date, 72% spent vs 83% budgeted through October, due to fewer activities and careful monitoring of costs by committees.
- 3. The Net Loss through October 31 is (\$30,654).
- 4. Pines received a Cares Act PPP Loan of \$58,295. We have applied for and expect to receive forgiveness of this loan, which will allow the proceeds to be used to offset the net operating loss.


