Please give a warm welcome to our latest AmeriCorps NCCC team, Fire 4!



## Greetings Easter People,

I want to thank everyone who made our Lenten and Easter seasons a wonderful worship experience! I was truly moved by our small group gatherings and discussions surrounding our all-church Lenten book study of the *Sacred Echo*. I was equally moved by the times we gathered for worship during Holy Week, especially the choir's offering during the Maundy Thursday service. Needless to say Easter Sunday worship was outstanding and really blew me away with the high energy and great joy that filled our worship that fantastic day!

Now that we have journeyed through Lent and given witness to the Resurrection, I have been reflecting on our times together and wondering how those days, those worship services, the message of Jesus' life, death and the cross have changed me? Have the events of Easter changed me or transformed me in any way, or are they just events on a calendar we have to celebrate because we call ourselves Christian?



#### **STEWARDSHIP NOTES:**

- 1. Pledge income for 3 months is slightly ahead of budget. Non-pledge income received through March is 40% of the year's budget due to unexpected early gifts.
- 2. Overall expenses were slightly underbudget for three months.
- 3. Total Income was \$188,555; total expenses were \$157,557; leaving a Net Income of \$30,998 for March, still a good start for the year.

### AN OFFERING OF PRESENCE AND PRAYER



Joy Kreider recently wrote about the meaning she found in a familiar story about Jesus. She has graciously given me permission to share the italicized excerpt below from her article. MINISTRY The sentence which impacted me the most reads, "What we have to offer each other is a willingness to lovingly stay and pray". It struck me because it summarizes what Stephen Ministers do – be present, listen and pray.

For some of us, it is hard to acknowledge the need for such help during difficult times. Thus, I was also struck by Joy's observation that Jesus asked his disciples for the same gifts which Stephen Ministers pledge to provide – to stay and pray. In so doing, Jesus modeled the behavior we hope care receivers will emulate, which is to ask for support.

In the garden of Gethsemane Jesus asked his disciples for two precious gifts--to stay awake with him and to pray, and they failed miserably at both. A few days earlier Jesus rode into Jerusalem with celebration in the streets. To the disciples messianic freedom from Rome must have felt like it was moments away, and now, instead, the disciples were huddled in the cold, trying to support a leader who was in profound emotional travail. Would they see another morning, or would they be carried off to imprisonment and death?

When we walk with the hurting, we often struggle to stay present and to pray. It's far easier to slip into "fix-it mode", or distance ourselves from pain that seems too extreme. Someone else's deep suffering can elicit anxiety within us, putting us in touch with unresolved hurts in our own lives, and causing either agitation or emotional shut down. All too often, trauma survivors describe speaking truthfully about their suffering only to find their friends and family running the other way. Jesus's request for prayerful presence, I believe, welled up from his deep humanity. He did not want to face the worst night of his life alone, even as the agony of a necessary but excruciating choice caused him to feel a profound need of care.

What we have to offer each other is a willingness to lovingly stay and pray! To touch an untouchable, to listen to the silenced, to acknowledge and offer personhood to the dismissed, to tend the wounds of the sick, and fervently stay and love even when we want to run away is a central call of the gospels! And, now in the garden, Jesus longed for presence and prayer in the night-time of his own fear\*\* (to borrow from Gillard's hymn).

If you feel a need for such support from a Stephen Minister, please contact either Ann Guerra or me and we will discuss the possibility of your experiencing the gifts of presence and prayer.
