



STEWARDSHIP NOTES:

- 1. Total Income received through November 30 is \$604,043, 87% of the \$691,230 income budgeted for 2021. This is slightly below forecast for the 11 months, but December is typically a higher than normal month for income.
- 2. Total expenses through November 30 are \$610,752, 88% of the budgeted \$691,000 approved budget.
- 3. Net Income through November 30 is a negative \$6,709, which is significantly lower than the negative net income of \$20,541 as of October 31.
- 4. Special thanks to all who gave generously in November and continue to give in December. We are much closer to our budgeted break even Net Income goal for 2021.

The end of the year is a great time to reflect on and share your blessings. Year end giving must be received or postmarked by December 31 in order to be included on your 2021 donation statement from Pines. The church office will close at noon on December 31.

Christ caring for people through people **Stephen Ministry**


When I finished a recent word puzzle, I found that the quote was by the English author George Eliot, from her novel Middlemarch. It was a good puzzle, but an even better quote. "What we call despair is often the painful eagerness of unfed hope."

I had never thought about hope needing to be fed, or, for that matter, that eagerness might be sometimes painful. Perhaps, though, the apostle Paul had these things in mind with his statement in 1 Corinthians 13 that faith, hope, and love "abide" – they survive, they grow, they last. Now faith and love we think about often, and we fully understand that each requires repeated attention and effort to flourish in our lives. They have to be nourished regularly – fed, if you will - lest they starve! Hope, though, is too easily overlooked as a quality sitting hungry at the training table of virtue development.

But Eliot rightly points out that neglecting to feed *hope* leads directly to despair. Many are the stories of people in desperate circumstances who managed to survive by the strength of their hope for favorable outcomes. They were willing to make the effort to put aside that deadly despair by nourishing their hope. And so it is with us. *Hope* needs to be fed.

One way to do this is to speak out loud both our miseries and our hopes for the future. It's doubtful that we can speak the reality we seek into actual existence, but we can definitely speak the hope into existence! And that is what Stephen Ministers are for – to listen to you speak your hopes into existence. Don't let despair control your life! Feed the hope that is yours to nourish. Ask for a Stephen Minister to listen.

I can't believe 2021 is almost over. But what a year – our biggest ever! We not only reached more kids with the Gospel but also helped feed around 1500 persons per month – all without ever compromising the Gospel. We stay true to Word of God by "speaking the truth in love" (Ephesians 4:15). So how did this happen? Time and time again, the Lord opened new doors.

First, we connected the Houston satellite church of Open Doors Experience Church ("Open Doors") (based in Burleson, TX) to the Outreach Center of West Houston (location where we minister to our students). Why does that matter? Open Doors feeds large numbers of the poor all over the world. Center Ministries ministers to "At Risk" kids in the Spring Branch area near Stratford High School. Result – the very people we minister too now receive free food including frozen meats on the 3rd Saturday of each month. Beginning in March of this year, Open Doors is up to feeding around 1500 persons per month. Although Center Ministries does not supply any food itself, we facilitate assistance to the families we serve, and we provide volunteer help each month which includes some of the kids we minister to.

Second, we are very close to achieving our long-term desire to become a full-time ministry and as it turns out, we were full-time for a little over 3 months this year. But the need is so great, 3 months isn't enough – it needs to be the full 12 months.

Third, Center Ministries stands as a place where the Gospel of Jesus Christ is preached based totally on the Word of God. Not with condemnation but also without compromise. Mark Trotter Visit us online at http://center-ministries.org/
